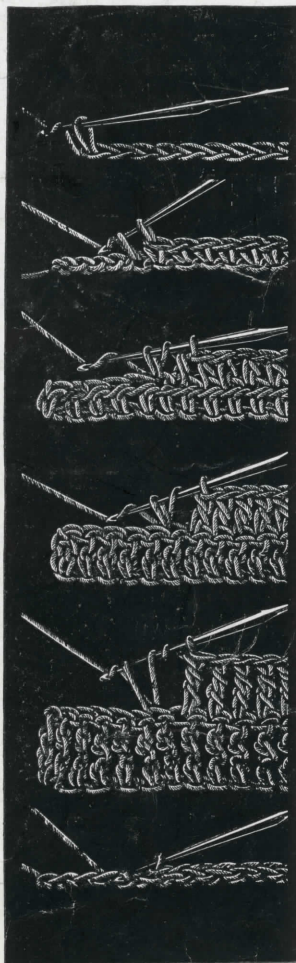

Crochet stitches and how to make them



Chain (ch). Make loop in thread, insert hook in loop, and draw main length of thread through. Continue to draw thread through each new loop formed until length desired.

Single Crochet (s c). Insert hook under 2 loops of st, draw thread through st (2 loops on hook), thread over hook, draw through the 2 loops.

Half Double Crochet (half d c). Make like d c until there are 3 loops on hook; then thread over and draw through all 3 loops.

Double Crochet (d c). Thread over hook, insert hook in st, and draw thread through (3 loops on hook), thread over hook, draw through 2 loops, thread over, and draw through the 2 remaining loops.

Treble (tr). Thread over hook twice, insert hook in st and draw thread through st (4 loops on hook), thread over, draw through 2 loops, thread over, draw through 2 loops, thread over, draw through remaining 2 loops. For a **Double Treble (d tr)**, thread over hook 3 times; and for a **Triple Treble (tr tr)**, thread over 4 times, taking off 2 loops at a time as in the tr.

Slip Stitch (sl st). Insert hook through st, catch thread, and, with one motion, draw through both the st and the 1 loop on hook. The sl st is used for joining, or when an invisible st is required.

Popcorn Stitch (pc st). Ch 1, 5 d c in next st, drop st from hook, insert hook back in ch-1 and draw loop through the one on hook.

Block (bl) and Space (sp). Make 4 d c over 4 sts of preceding row (this forms 1 bl), ch 2, skip 2 sts, make 1 bl. The bl and sp are used in Filet Crochet.

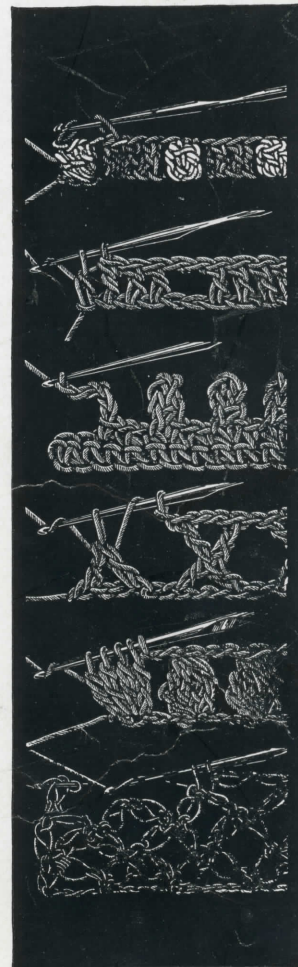
Picot (p). Make a ch of 3, 4 or 5 sts, according to length of p desired, and s c in the foundation or in the 1st st of ch.

Cross Stitch. Thread over twice, insert hook in st and draw thread through as for a tr (4 loops on hook), thread over, and draw through 2 loops, thread over, skip 2 sts, insert hook in next st, draw thread through (5 loops on hook), thread over and draw off 2 loops at a time 4 times, ch 2, 1 d c in the center point of the cross, thus completing the cross.

Cluster. Make 3 more tr in the same st, always holding the last loop of each tr on the hook; then, thread over hook and take off all remaining loops. A tight ch st should then be made to fasten the cluster.

Knot Stitch. Draw loop out on hook $\frac{1}{4}$ inch, draw thread through, making a ch st of it. Put hook between loop and single thread of this ch and make an s c.

Work another similar knot st, skip 4 sts of preceding row, 1 s c in next. Repeat from the beginning to end of row. Make $2\frac{3}{4}$ -inch knot sts to turn, 1 s c over double loop at right of 1st center knot of preceding row, 1 s c over double loop at left of same knot. 2 knot sts and repeat.

Simple Knitting Stitches

Casting on: Make a loop over left needle, pass right needle behind the loop, thread over right needle, draw through and place loop on left needle. Repeat for desired length.

Slipping a stitch: Slip the stitch from left needle to right needle without working it.

Increasing: To increase a stitch, knit one stitch in regular way but without slipping the stitch off the left needle, then knit another stitch through the back of same stitch and slip off.

Decreasing: To decrease a stitch, knit two together, or purl two together. It is advisable to decrease the 2nd and 3rd stitches from edge to make an even edge.

Binding off: To bind off, knit two stitches the regular

way, slip the first stitch over the second. Knit another stitch and repeat until only one stitch remains. Break thread and draw it through this last loop.

Knitting Plain: When desired number of stitches have been cast on, pass the right needle through the first loop, thread over, draw through and allow first stitch on left needle to slip off and repeat until no stitches remain on left needle.

Purling: Bring the thread in front of both needles. Pass the right needle through the loop, forward and in front of left needle. Thread over right needle and draw through, allowing stitch on left needle to slip off.

Ribbing: Cast on a number divisible by four, then knit 2, purl 2 across. Start next row with purl 2, knit 2.

Swagger Hat no. 28

22 Head-Size



Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 1 ball of color 106 Sport Green, and 1 ball of color 84 Beige. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 2.

Working both colors together as a double thread, ch 5. Join with sl st to form ring. **1st rnd:** 8 s c in ring. **2nd rnd:** 2 s c in each s c of previous rnd. **3rd rnd:** * 2 s c in 1st st, 1 s c in next and repeat from * around. **4th rnd:** * S c in next st, ch 1, s c in same st, s c in next st, and repeat from * around. **5th rnd:** * S c under ch-1, ch 2, s c in same place, s c in the single s c and repeat from * around. **6th rnd:** * S c under ch-2, ch 2, s c in same place. 2 s c in next single s c and repeat from * around. **7th rnd:** * S c under ch-2, ch 2, s c in same place. S c between next 2 s c, ch 2, s c in same place. Repeat from * around. **8th rnd:** * S c under ch-2, ch 2, s c in same place. Repeat from * around. **9th to 11th rnds incl:** Same as 8th rnd. **12th rnd:** * S c under ch-2, ch 2, s c in same place s c under next ch-2, ch 2, s c in same place, s c between next 2 s c, (an increase), and repeat from * around. **13th rnd:** * S c under ch-2, ch 2, s c in same place, s c under next ch-2, ch 2, s c

in same place, s c in s c of previous rnd (which made the increase), ch 2, s c in same st, and repeat from * around. **14th rnd:** Same as 8th rnd. **15th rnd:** Make 4 increases of 1 s c each, as done in 12th rnd, spaced evenly. Continue in pattern, without increasing, until work measures 7 inches in diameter. For a larger head-size add one or two more rnds, as necessary. Then make a plait from edge of crown to center so that work lies flat. Fasten together at edge of crown only, leaving plait open across end. Continue working same as 8th rnd until work measures 3 inches from fastening of plait to lower edge of crown.

Brim: 1st rnd: Work row of plain s c, making 3 s c to a pattern. **2nd rnd:** S c into 1st s c of previous rnd, ch 1, s c in same st, * skip 1 s c, s c in next, ch 1, s c in same st, and repeat from * around. **3rd rnd:** * S c under ch-1, ch 2, s c in same place, repeat from * around. **4th and subsequent rnds:** S c under ch-2, ch 2, s c in same place, ** s c in next st, * s c under ch-2, ch 2, s c in same place, repeat from * 2 more times. Repeat from ** around. Repeat this rnd until brim measures 2 inches. Break off.

Crocheted Overblouse no. 129

Size 34-36

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 7 balls of color 9 Yellow and 2 balls of color 82 Autumn Glow. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 6. Two buttons for collar.

Gauge: 2 patterns equal 1 inch; 9 rows equal 2 inches. For different size, or shaping of blouse, see directions on page 26.

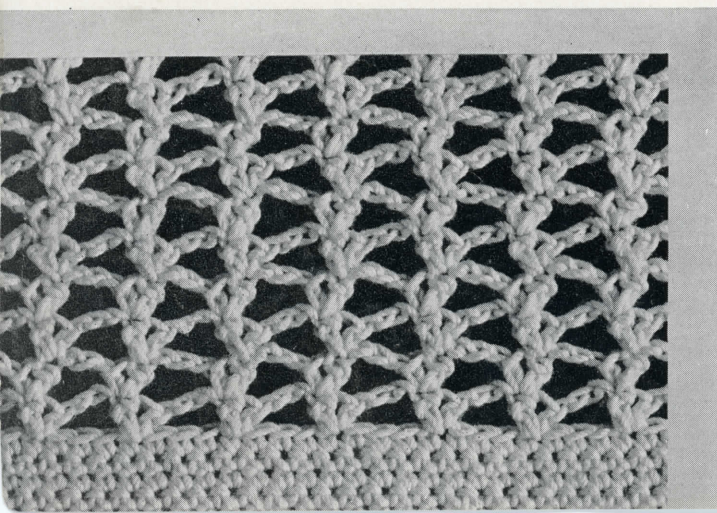
Back: With Yellow, ch 151. **1st row:** 1 s c in 2nd ch from hook, and in each st of foundation ch. Ch 1, turn. **2nd row:** 1 s c in each s c, ch 1, turn. **3rd, 4th and 5th rows:** Repeat 2nd row. At end of 5th row, ch 5, turn.

1st row of lace pattern: * Skip 3 sts, 1 d c in next st, 1 s c in same st, ch 3, repeat from * across, ending with 1 d c in last st (omitting last s c), ch 5, turn. There will be 35 patterns in row. **2nd row:** * Skip the ch 3 and s c of previous row, 1 d c and s c into d c, ch 3, repeat from * across, ending with 1 d c in 3rd st of turning ch, ch 5, turn. (This 2nd row is the pattern row.) **3rd to 7th rows incl:** Repeat 2nd row, making ch 3 instead of ch 5 at the end of the 7th row. **8th row:** Work 34 patterns, d c and s c in last d c, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning ch, ch 3, turn. **9th row:** Skip 1st d c and s c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 3, (33 patterns), 1 d c in last d c, 1 d c in next st of turning ch, ch 5, turn. **10th row:** Skip the 1st 2 d c, pattern across, ending with d c in last d c, d c in next st of turning ch, ch 5, turn. (1 pattern has been decreased on each side.) **11th to**

15th rows incl: Work in pattern without decreasing. **16th and 17th rows:** Decrease 1 pattern on each side as in 9th and 10th rows.

18th to 31st rows incl: Work evenly in pattern, then increase 1 pattern on each side as follows: **32nd row:** 1 d c in 1st d c, ch 3, pattern across, 2 d c in 3rd st of turning ch, ch 5, turn. **33rd row:** 1 d c and s c in 2nd d c, ch 3, pattern across, ending with 1 d c and 1 s c in last d c, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning ch, ch 5, turn. **34th to 41st rows incl:** Work evenly in pattern. **42nd and 43rd rows:** Increase 1 pattern each side as in 32nd and 33rd rows. **44th to 68th rows incl:** Work pattern evenly, omitting the turning ch at the end of the 68th row. Piece should now measure about 15 inches. **69th row:** (armhole) Sl st 1 pattern, sl st to next d c, ch 3, 30 patterns across, d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 5, turn. **70th row:** Work 30 patterns across, d c and s c in last d c, 1 d c in next st of turning ch, ch 5, turn. **71st to 84th rows incl:** Work evenly in pattern. **85th row:** Work 15 patterns, 1 d c in next d c, ch 5, turn. Work on these 15 patterns for 10 more rows, ending at neck edge. Shape shoulder by working 11 patterns, 1 d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, turn. Sl st 2 patterns, and sl st to next d c, ch 3, 3 patterns, 1 d c and s c in next d c, ch 3, turn. D c into 1st d c, ch 3, d c and s c into next d c, d c in next d c, break thread. Attach thread in same center d c already worked, ch 5, and work left side to correspond.

Front: Chain 167. **1st row:** Beginning in 2nd ch from hook, 1 s c in each st of foundation ch. Work same as back, having 41 patterns instead of 35, making same decreases and increases, up to 69th row (armhole). **69th row:** Sl st 2 patterns, work 35 patterns, 1 d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, turn. **70th row:** Work 33 patterns, 1 d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 5, turn. **71st row:** Work 32 patterns, d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 5, turn. **72nd to 87th rows incl:** Work evenly in pattern. **88th row:** Work 12 patterns, 1 d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 3,



turn. **89th row:** Pattern across, ch 5, turn. Repeat these last 2 rows for 3 times (10 patterns across). In next row work 10 patterns, 1 d c in turning ch, ch 5, turn. Work 2 rows even, ending at neck edge. Shape shoulder by working 6 patterns, 1 d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, turn. Sl st 2 patterns, sl st to next d c, 1 d c in next d c, break thread. Work other side to correspond, leaving 6 patterns free in center.

Sleeve: Ch 91. **1st row:** Skip 5 sts, * 1 d c in next st, 1 s c in next st, ch 3, skip 2 sts, repeat from * across, ending with d c in last st, ch 5, turn. (29 patterns across). **2nd to 55th rows incl:** Work evenly in pattern. **56th row:** To shape top of sleeve, sl st 1 pattern, work 25 patterns, 1 d c and s c in next d c, d c in next d c, ch 5, turn. **57th row:** Work 24 patterns, 1 d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 5, turn. **58th and 59th rows:** Work 25 patterns, 1 d c in turning ch, ch 3, turn. **60th row:** Work pattern to within 1 pattern from end, d c and s c in next d c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 3, turn. Repeat this row until there are 5 patterns left, then work 1 row with 1 d c in each d c and ch-1 between. Break off.

Cuff: With Autumn Glow, ch 30. **1st row:** 1 s c in 2nd ch from hook and 1 s c in each st of foundation ch. Ch 1, turn. **2nd row:** 1 s c into back loop of each s c. Ch 1, turn. Repeat 2nd row until there are 71 ridges (2 rows form a ridge). Then turn and work 1 s c in each ridge along one long side. Then work another row of s c over s c's on the long side.

Collar: With Autumn Glow, ch 36. **1st row:** 1 s c in 2nd ch from hook and 1 s c in each st of foundation ch.

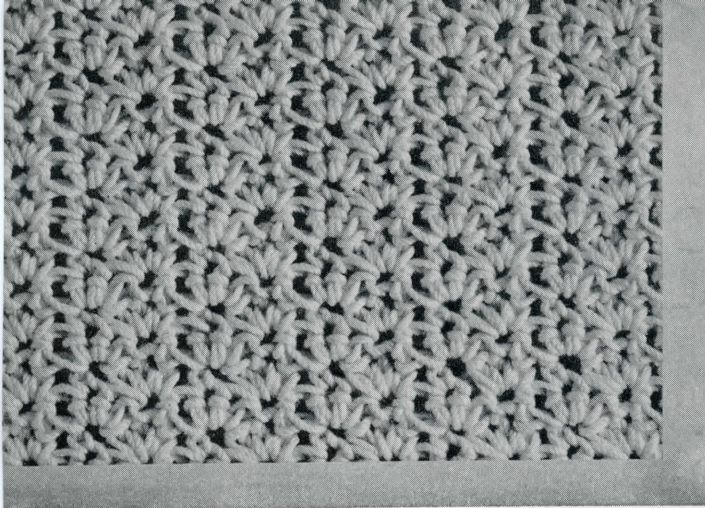


Ch 1, turn. Work same as cuff until there are 103 ridges. Finish along one long side same as cuff.

Belt: With Yellow, ch 21. **1st row:** Beginning in 2nd ch from hook, 1 s c in each st of foundation ch. Ch 1, turn. S c over s c for length desired (28 inches). Fasten with 2 snappers. Sew all together, and place one button at neck edge, and one button at collar corner, with corresponding loops. The edges of the collar and cuffs on which the double rows of s c were made are sewed to the blouse.

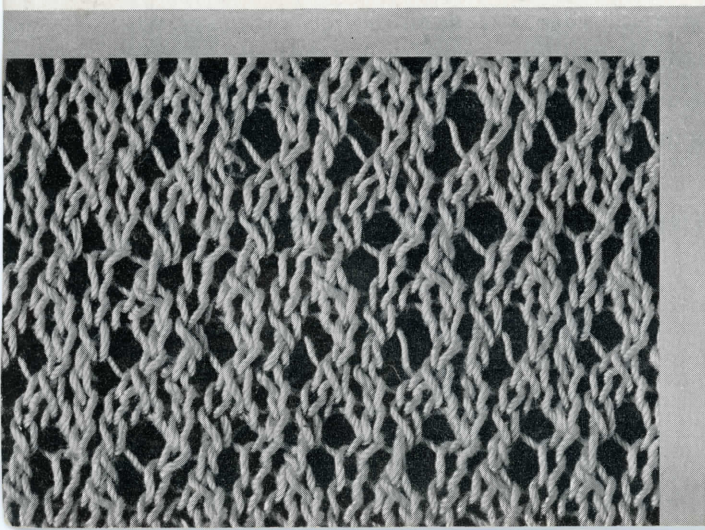
Waistcoat Blouse no. 134

Size 34-36

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 7 balls of color 26 Nile Green. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 1 or 2. Talon Hookless Fastener, 15 inches long. Two buttons.

Gauge: 3 meshes equal 1 inch; 3 rows equal 1 inch. For different size or shaping, see directions on page 26. Work should be done very loosely throughout.

Back: Ch 99, turn. **1st row:** In 3rd ch from hook make 1 s c, * skip 1 ch, in next ch put 3 s c, skip 1 ch, make 1 s c in next ch, and repeat from * keeping work very loose. Ch 2, turn. **2nd row:** * Into single s c of row below put 3 s c, and 1 s c into 2nd st of group of 3 s c. Repeat from * across ending row with 1 s c in ch-2 at end of row below. Ch 2, turn. Repeat 2nd row, increasing 1 mesh at each end on 6th and 12th rows. When work is 8½ inches deep (length of underarm) decrease 1 whole mesh (1 s c, 3 s c) at each end for underarm. Then decrease ½ mesh at each end on every row for 6 rows. Work straight for 34 rows, bringing work to shoulder. Decrease 1 mesh at each end every row for 18 rows. Then finish off.



Front: Ch 31, turn. **1st to 13th rows incl:** Same as for back, keeping front edge even. **14th row:** Work 5 meshes, then ch 19 (to allow for pocket), skip 5 complete meshes, then work across row. Ch 2, turn. On next row, work in ch-19, as in 1st row of back. Continue until work is 9½ inches long. Then decrease 1 mesh for underarm. Be sure that it is not on the front edge. Decrease ½ mesh at arm for 6 rows, then work straight for 34 rows. Decrease 1 mesh at each end every row until all meshes are worked off. Break thread. Make other side to correspond.

Pocket: In front loops of sts at lower edge of pocket opening, make a row of s c. At end of row, ch 1, turn, and put 1 s c in each st of row below. Repeat for a 3rd row. Tack the 2 ends to the body of work so that the band will stay flat. Attach thread to wrong side of work, then put 1 s c in the back loops of sts on the lower edge of pocket, and in ch on upper edge. Work round and round until 12 rows have been made. Then break thread and sew across bottom.

Sleeve: Ch 51, turn. Repeat directions for back, but increase ½ mesh at each end every 10th row until sleeve is desired length. Then decrease ½ mesh at each end every row until all meshes have been worked off. Attach thread to the bottom of sleeve, ch 1, 1 s c in each st of foundation ch. Continue with 2 more rows of s c. Sew back and fronts together at shoulder seams and underarm. Then attach thread at neck and work row of s c around to other side of front. Ch 1, turn.

Put 1 s c in 1st st, ch 5 (to allow for buttonhole), skip 5 s c. Then continue around, making a similar buttonhole, 1 s c from the other end. Ch 1, turn. 1 s c in each st of row below, and work until 11 rows have been made. Then work as in 2nd row of back in the mesh pattern and make 12 rows. Then work 3 rows of s c around entire jacket and finish off. Sew sleeves in at the armhole.

Wave Crest no. 130

Size 34-36

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 3 balls of color 40 French Rose, and 2 balls of color 70 Blue Jewel. Milward's knitting needles, No. 3 (3 millimeter) and 1 pair of steel knitting needles No. 1 (2½ millimeter). Milward's steel crochet hook No. 6. Six button forms, ¾ inch in diameter.

Back: With French Rose, using No. 3 needles, cast on 96 sts. Change to No. 1 needles and knit in ribbing of k 2, p 2 for $2\frac{3}{4}$ inches. Change to No. 3 needles and k 1 row, increasing 1 st in every 10th st (105 sts on needle—a multiple of 3). P 1 row. **Pattern: 1st row:** K 2 sts, * k 2 together, thread over, k 1, repeat from *, ending k. **2nd row:** * P 1, p 2 together, thread over, repeat from *, ending p 3. **3rd row:** K across. **4th row:** P across. **5th row:** K 2, * thread over, k 2 together, k 1, repeat from *, ending k. **6th row:** P 2, * p 2 together, thread over, p 1, repeat from *, ending p. **7th and 8th rows:** Same as 3rd and 4th. Work in pattern for 8

inches from top of ribbing, ending with 6th row. This brings work to armhole. Bind off 9 sts beginning of next 2 rows, work 1st and 2nd rows in pattern, then decrease 1 st at beginning and end of the 3rd, 4th and 5th rows by knitting the 1st 2 and last 2 sts together, and continuing in pattern. (5th row begins k 2 together, k 1, thread over, k 2 together, k 1, etc.) Work even in pattern for 6 inches ending with 6th row of pattern. Bind off 9 sts at beginning of next 6 rows, then bind off remaining sts for neck.

Front: In same manner as for back, cast on 104 sts and work in ribbing. Change to No. 3 needles and k 1 row,



increasing 1 st in every 10th (114 sts on needle). P next row. Work in pattern for 7 inches, ready for 7th row. K 39 sts, place remaining sts on stitch holder, turn. Cast on 10 sts and p across. Continue working the 39 sts in pattern, and the additional 10 sts in garter st, for 1 inch, ending with 6th row. Bind off 9 sts beginning

Two-Piece Surplice Dress no. 126

Size 34-36

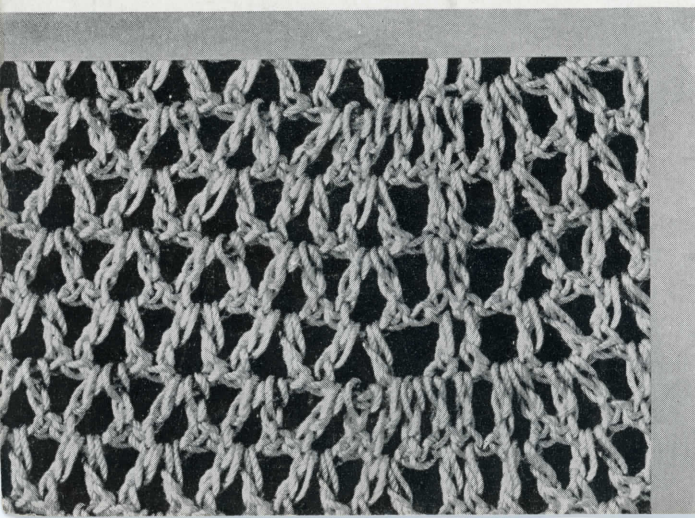
Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 13 balls of color 40 French Rose, and 1 ball of White to trim surplice band. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 3.

Gauge: 3 triangles equal 1 inch, 3 rows equal 1 inch. For different size or shaping, see directions on page 26.

Skirt: Beginning at waist, ch 205, turn. **1st row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, * ch 2, d c in same ch, skip next 2 ch, d c in next. Repeat from * making 10 triangles, then ch 1, skip next 2 ch, d c in next, d c in next ch, ch 1 (this starts gore pattern). Repeat from * along ch making 6 panels of 10 triangles each, ending row with 2 d c together, ch 3 (to count as d c), turn. **2nd row:** D c over next d c, ch 1, * d c in next triangle, ch 2, d c in same triangle. Repeat from * for 10 triangles, then ch 1, d c in each of next 2 d c, ch 1. Repeat from * to end of row, ch 3, turn. **3rd, 4th and 5th rows:** Continue with pattern. **6th row:** Instead of turning, continue going all around skirt (the 1st 5 rows forming an opening at side). **7th row:** Increase on this row. To increase make 1 extra triangle on each side of gore—that is, make 1 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in ch-1 of previous row. Continue for 7 rows, increase on next. * Continue for 8 rows, increase on next. Repeat from * once. Continue for 10 rows, increase on next. Continue for 15 rows, increase on next. Continue without increasing until 4 rows less than the desired length. Next row, 1 d c in each triangle and d c in each d c. The next 3 rows are d c in each d c. Break off.

Blouse: Back: Ch 115, turn. **1st row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, ch 2, d c in same ch, * skip 2 sts of foundation ch, d c in next, ch 2, d c in same ch. Repeat from * along ch (38 triangles in all). Ch 3, turn. **2nd to 29th rows incl:** Continue evenly with pattern. At end of 29th row, ch 1, turn. **30th row:** Begin to decrease for armhole. S c in each st over 1st 2 triangles, ch 3, begin to make a triangle over the 3rd triangle and continue with pattern across to within 2 triangles from end of row. Ch 3, turn. **31st row:** Decrease 1 triangle at beginning of row by making d c in 1st triangle and make a triangle over next triangle. Continue with pattern across, decreasing the last triangle of row by making 1 d c in last triangle. Ch 3, turn. **32nd to 39th rows incl:** Continue evenly with pattern. **40th row:** Decrease 1st and last triangles of row as done previously. **41st, 42nd and 43rd rows:** Continue evenly with pattern. **44th row:** Decrease 1st and last triangles of row. **45th, 46th and 47th rows:** Continue evenly. **48th row:** Decrease 1st and last triangles of row. **49th, 50th and 51st rows:** Continue evenly. **52nd row:** 2 s c in each triangle. Break off.

Front: Ch 94, turn. **1st row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, ch 2, d c in same ch, * skip 2 ch, d c in next, ch 2, d c in same. Repeat from * to end of ch (31 triangles in all), ch 3, turn. **2nd row:** * D c in next triangle, ch 2, d c in same triangle. Repeat from * to within 1 triangle from end of row, then 1 d c in last triangle (this is a decrease). Ch 3, turn. **3rd row:** * D c in next triangle, ch 2, d c in same triangle. Repeat from * to end of row. Ch 3, turn. **4th to 23rd rows incl:** Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows alternately. **24th to 29th rows incl:** Do not decrease but work triangle into triangle. At end of 29th row, ch 1, turn. **30th row:** Decrease for armhole. S c in each st over the first 5 triangles, ch 3, and make a triangle over next triangle, and continue with pattern, decreasing the last triangle of this row as done previously. Ch 3, turn. **31st to 44th rows incl:** Same as 2nd row. Work other side to correspond, sew up underarm seams.



Front Border: 1st row: Holding the wrong side of front towards you, attach thread (French Rose) and make a row of d c in the sps, keeping work flat (about 2 d c in each sp). Break off, turn. **2nd and subsequent rows:** Attach White thread, and d c in each d c, but increase 1 d c at armhole edge, on each row. Ch 3, turn. *Work another row of White, then attach French Rose and work one row. Repeat from * once. Break off. Work other side to correspond.

Sleeve: Ch 52, turn. **1st row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, ch 2, d c in same ch, * skip 2 ch, d c in next, ch 2, d c in same ch. Repeat from * to end of ch (17 triangles), ch 3, turn. **2nd and 3rd rows:** Continue evenly with pattern. **4th row:** Increase 1 triangle at end of this row. (To increase, make 1 extra triangle in the last triangle of previous row). Ch 3, turn. **5th to 9th rows incl:** Continue evenly with pattern. **9th to 18th rows incl:** Repeat rows 4th to 8th incl. **19th row:** Same as 4th. **20th and 21st rows:** Work evenly. **22nd row:** Increase 1 triangle at end of row. **23rd to 46th rows incl:** Repeat 20th, 21st and 22nd rows. **47th and 48th rows:** Increase 1 triangle at end of row. **49th row:** Work evenly. **50th row:** S c over 1st 3 triangles, ch 3 and make a triangle in 4th triangle and in each triangle to within 3 triangles from end of row. Ch 3, turn. **51st to 64th rows incl:** Work triangle over each triangle but decrease last triangle of each row. (To decrease, make 1 d c in last triangle). Ch 3, turn. **65th to 70th rows incl:** Decrease as previously done for back at beginning and at end of each row.

Band: Ch 25, turn. **1st row:** D c in 4th ch from hook, ch 2, d c in same ch, * skip 2 ch, d c in next ch, ch 2, d c in same ch. Repeat from * to end of row (8 triangles), ch, 3, turn. **2nd and subsequent rows:** Work pattern until work measures (stretched) your own measurement, taken $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches below natural waistline. Then decrease 1 triangle at beginning and at end of last 4 rows. Sew band to blouse, with pointed end at right front, easing in the blouse as necessary. Sew up sleeves, leaving a small opening to fasten with snap at wrist, and sew in to blouse. Holding



right side of blouse towards you, finish right front, neckline across back, and left front with a row of s c.

Ridge Knitted Blouse no. 124

Size 34-36—Illustrated on opposite page

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 7 balls of color 126 Spanish Red and 1 ball of color 68 Skipper Blue. Milward's knitting needles, No. 4 (3½ millimeter) and 1 pair of steel knitting needles No. 1 (2½ millimeter). Milward's steel crochet hook No. 4. 1 red button, ½ inch in diameter.

Gauge: 7 sts equal 1 inch, 8 rows equal 1 inch. The entire blouse is worked with 2 strands of cotton.

Back: With Spanish Red, using No. 4 needles, cast on 90 sts. Change to No. 1 needles and work in ribbing of k 2, p 2 for 3½ inches. Change to No. 4 needles and k 1 row, increasing 1 st in the 5th st and then every 9th st (100 sts on needle). * **2nd row:** P across. **3rd and 4th rows:** K across. Repeat from *, making an increase at both ends of every 5th row, which will be the 1st of the k rows. Continue working with increases until there are 122 sts on needle and piece measures about 11½ inches from beginning. (The pattern alternates 3 rows of stockinette st and 3 rows of purling, giving a striped effect). There should be 21 stripes when there are 122 sts on needle. Work 2 rows in pattern, bind off 7 sts at beginning of next 2 rows, then decrease 1 st at beginning of next 12 rows (96 sts), ending with the 2 knitted rows.

Right upper back: Work over 48 sts, continuing the decreases at armhole, and working other edge even, until there are 38 sts across. Then decrease at armhole on every row for 3 times. * From armhole bind off 4 sts, work across. At end of next row, decrease 1 st. Repeat from * 3 more times. Work 2 rows even and bind off last 15 sts. Work other side to correspond.

Front: Cast on 96 sts as for back, and work in ribbing for 3½ inches. Change to No. 4 needles and bind off 4 sts at beginning of row. K across, increasing 1 st in 3rd and every 9th st (102 sts). **2nd row:** Bind off 4 sts, p across. **3rd row:** K across. **4th row:** Attach Skipper Blue and k across, decreasing 1 st at both ends. P next row. Drop Skipper Blue and with Spanish Red, k 2 rows, decreasing 1 st at both ends of last k row. P next row. Repeat from 3rd row until there are 28 sts across. P next row, bind off on next row by knitting 2 sts together.

Left side front: With Spanish Red, using No. 4 needles, cast on 84 sts and work in pattern for 6 rows. On 7th row bind off 4 sts. Decrease 1 st at both ends of 10th row and every 3rd row thereafter for 4 more times. Decrease on every other row for 6 times, then every row for 8 times. * At neck edge bind off 2 sts and on next row decrease 1 st at both ends. Repeat from * 2 more times. Then bind off 3 sts at beginning of every row, making a decrease at end of rows for 6 rows. Bind off on next row.

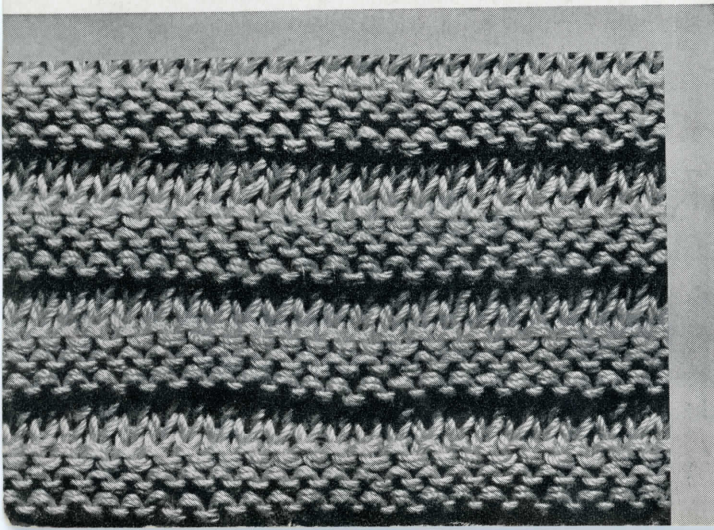
Right side front: Work to correspond, binding off the 4 sts on the 6th row instead of the 7th row.

Sleeve: With Spanish Red cast on 32 sts and work in pattern, one edge to be even, and increasing 1 st every other row on other edge starting on 5th row, until there are 47 sts across. Cast on 24 sts on next row (uneven edge) and work even for 8 rows. Decrease 1 st every other row for 2 times, work even for 17 rows, increase 1 st every other row 2 times, work even for 7 rows, bind off 24 sts next row, then decrease every other row until 32 sts are left. Work even for 6 rows, bind off.

Cuff: With Spanish Red, cast on 70 sts and work in pattern of 5 rows for each stripe for 5 stripes. Bind off.

Collar: With Spanish Red, cast on 100 sts and knit in stockinette st for 3½ inches, bind off.

Sew straight edge of side fronts to center front, with stockinette stripes coming first. Sew underarm seams, and work 1 row of s c around shoulder and armhole. Work 1 row of s c around armhole of sleeve. Join cuffs so that the 3 purlled stripes are on right side. Join collar so that the purlled side will roll down on right side. Make a loop for button to fasten blouse at back of neck.

next row, and work 3 rows even. Make a decrease at armhole on next 3 rows. Work even until armhole measures 6 inches (28 ridges in garter st edge). Bind off the 10 sts and work in pattern for 9 rows, then bind off 9 sts at a time from armhole for shoulder. Attach thread and k the sts on stitch holder, p next row to within last 9 sts, which are to be knitted in garter st. Work right front to correspond, making 5 buttonholes in the garter st band, the 1st being made on 7th ridge, and other with 4 ridges between. (1st buttonhole is made at same time that armhole is shaped.) To make buttonhole, k 3, bind off 3, k 3, pattern. On next row, cast on 3 sts where the 3 were bound off. When last buttonhole is completed, work until there are 28 ridges, then bind off garter sts and pattern sts to within 27 sts from end. Work in pattern for 9 rows, then bind off 9 sts at a time from armhole for shoulder.

Sleeve: In usual way, cast on 64 sts, work in ribbing for 2 inches. Change to No. 3 needles and k 1 row, increasing 1 st in 5th, then in every 8th st (72 sts on needle). P 1 row. Work in pattern for 3 inches ending with 6th row of pattern. At beginning of next 2 rows, bind off 6 sts, work 1st and 2nd rows even, and on next and every 3rd, 4th and 5th rows, make a decrease at beginning and end, working the other rows even. Work until there are 30 sts on needle, and ready for 6th row. Work 6th row in pattern, but omit thread over sts, and bind off on next row tightly.

Collar: With Blue Jewel, cast on 220 sts, using No. 3 needles, work in garter st for 4 ridges, then work in pattern, with the 1st and last 5 sts in garter st, until

piece measures 4 inches, ready for 2nd or 6th row of pattern. Work either row, omitting the thread over stitches. Then work 3 rows of ribbing with No. 1 needles (k 2, p 2), and bind off tightly. Attach as in illustration.

Buttons: Using crochet hook, with Blue Jewel, ch 2.
1st rnd: 6 s c in 2nd ch. **2nd rnd:** 2 s c in each s c. **3rd rnd:** 1 s c in each s c. **4th rnd:** 2 s c in every other s c, with 1 s c between. **5th rnd:** S c over s c. **6th rnd:** Slip button inside, and close up by s c in every other s c until button is all enclosed. Leave piece of thread to sew button to blouse.





Brimmed Sport Hat no. 27

22 Head-Size

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 2 balls of color 58 Dark Red. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 4.

Crown: To begin, ch 3. **1st rnd:** 6 s c in 2nd st of ch. **2nd rnd:** 2 s c in each st of previous rnd. **3rd rnd:** * 2 s c in next st, 1 s c in next st, repeat from * around. **4th rnd:** * 2 s c in next st, 1 s c in each of next 2 sts, repeat from * around. Continue increasing 6 times each rnd at equal distances apart. Do not make increases over increases of previous rnd. Work until crown measures $5\frac{3}{4}$ inches in diameter. For larger head-size work more rnds as necessary. Work 2 rnds without increasing. In next rnd increase 5 times, spaced at equal distances, work 2 rnds without increasing. Increase 4 times in next rnd, spacing evenly, work 3 rnds without increasing, and increase 4 times in next rnd. Then work evenly until crown measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches from center to edge. Increase 6 times in next rnd. * Work 1 rnd even. Increase 7 times on next rnd. Repeat from * once and work 3 rnds without increasing. *Then decrease 10 times in next rnd, work 1 rnd even, repeat from * once. Then decrease every 11th st

for 2 rnds. Work even until crown measures $7\frac{1}{4}$ inches, from center to edge. Sl st last st, ch 1, turn.

Brim: Use thread double and work in back loop of sts (this row only), making 1 s c in each st and increasing in every 5th st. Join with sl st, ch 1, turn. Work 5 rows even, taking up both loops of sts and always joining each row at end with sl st, ch 1 and turn for entire brim. **7th row:** Increase in every 12th st. **8th to 11th rows incl:** Work even. **12th row:** Increase in every 20th st. Work 2 rows even, and for last row work over millinery wire, and fasten off.

Bow: With thread double, ch 13. S c in 2nd ch from hook and s c in each st of ch. Ch 1, turn. Repeat making s c over s c until piece measures $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches long. Form into bow and wrap thread 15 times around center of bow. Fasten off.

Cord: With 3 strands of 32 threads each, make a braided cord long enough to go around hat. Fasten off under bow, placing bow at the front. Drape the crown in a downward fold just above the cord.

Fagot Knitted Blouse no. 137

Size 34-36

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 6 balls of color 126 Spanish Red, 1 ball of color 55 Navy Blue, and 1 ball of White. Milward's knitting needles, 1 pair of No. 4 ($3\frac{1}{2}$ millimeter) and 1 pair No. 3 (3 millimeter). Milward's steel crochet hook No. 4.

Thread is used double throughout, except for the tie that forms the small top collar.

Gauge: (Stockinette) 6 sts equal 1 inch; 7 rows equal 1 inch. For different size or shaping, see directions on page 26.

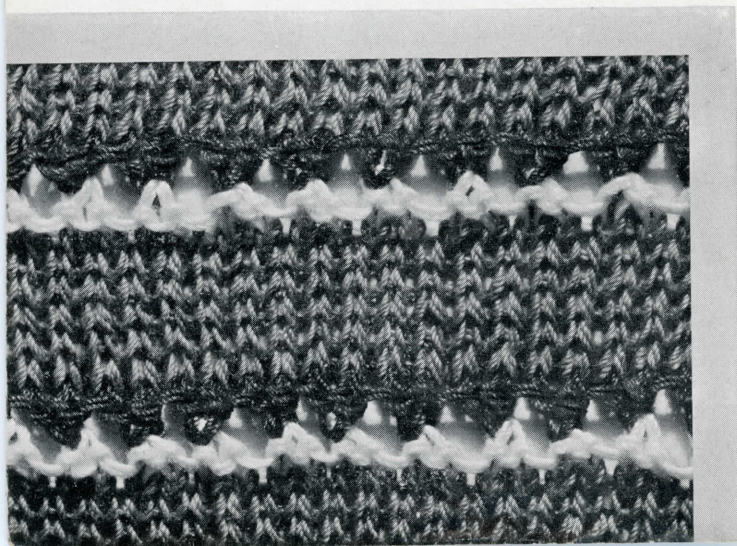
Back: Using No. 3 needles with Spanish Red, cast on 84 sts. Work ribbing (k 2, p 2) for $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Change to No. 4 needles and increase 12 sts by k 1, p 1 into same st every 7th st. **1st row:** K across. **2nd row:** P across. **3rd to 6th rows incl:** Alternate 1st and 2nd rows. **7th row:** Change to White thread and k across. **8th row:** K across. **9th row:** Change to Navy Blue thread and * k 2 together, thread over needle and repeat from * across. **10th row:** K across. The 10th row completes the pattern. Change to Spanish Red and repeat until 6 stripes have been made, then decrease 5 sts at each end for underarm. Then decrease 1 st at each end every other row until 2 more stripes have been made. Then work 24 rows without decreasing, which brings work to shoulder. Finish rest of back with Spanish Red in stockinette st. Decrease 6 sts at beginning of each row and work for 8 rows. Cast off remaining sts.



Front: Follow directions for making back and work until the front is 7 stripes (1 stripe above underarm). On the 1st row of the 8th stripe, cast off 8 sts at center for beginning of neck. Work one side, decreasing 1 st at each end every other row for 1 more stripe (10 rows). Work straight at each end for 16 rows. Continue with Spanish Red and cast off 6 sts at the armhole each row until all sts are worked off. Make other side to correspond. Sew back and front together at underarm and at shoulder.

Sleeves: Using No. 3 needles with Spanish Red, cast on 52 sts and work 8 rows of ribbing (k 2, p 2). Change to No. 4 needles and increase 1 st every 4th st by k 1, p 1 in same st. Repeat directions for back and work 2 stripes (20 rows). Decrease 5 sts at each end for underarm. Then decrease 1 st at each end every other row for 26 rows. Then with Spanish Red work in stockinette st, decreasing 1 st at each end every row for 3 more rows. Then cast off. Sew up sleeve seams and ease them into armholes of blouse.

Size 10 or 12

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 13 balls of color 68 Skipper Blue and 5 balls of color 70 Blue Jewel for Jacket and Skirt; and 3 balls of color 70 Blue Jewel and 1 ball of color 68 Skipper Blue for Blouse. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 3 for Jacket and Skirt; and Nos. 1 and 5 for Blouse.

Gauge: Jacket, 8 half d c equal 1 inch, 6 rows equal 1 inch. Blouse, 6 half d c equal 1 inch, 4 rows equal 1 inch. For different size or shaping, see page 26.

Jacket: Front: (right side): Ch 115, turn. **1st row:** 1 half d c in 3rd ch from hook, and in each st of ch, ch 2, turn. **2nd to 5th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each st, ch 2, turn. **6th row:** 1 half d c in each of next 66 sts, ch 4 (for a buttonhole), skip 4 sts, 1 half d c in each of next 10 sts, ch 4, skip 4 sts, 1 half d c in each of next 10 sts, ch 4, skip 4 sts, 1 half d c in each of next 15 sts, ch 2, turn. **7th row:** 1 half d c in each st, and 2 half d c in last st (an increase). Ch 2, turn. **8th row:** Same as 2nd row. **9th to 16th rows incl:** Repeat 7th and 8th rows. The end where increases are made is the neck edge. **17th row:** Same as 7th row, ch 3, turn. **18th row:** 2 half d c in 3rd st from hook (2 increases), 1 half d c in each st, ch 2, turn. **19th to 29th rows incl:** Repeat 17th and 18th rows alternately. At 22nd row make 3 buttonholes to correspond with those of 6th row. **30th to 57th rows incl:** Decrease 2 sts at beginning of each even row and decrease 2 sts at end of each odd row. Make left side of front the same as right without buttonholes.

Back: Ch 83, turn. **1st row:** 1 half d c in 3rd ch from hook and in each st of ch. In last st make 3 half d c. Ch 2, turn. **2nd to 28th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each st, and at beginning of each odd row make 2 increases, and at end of each even row make 2 increases. **29th to 56th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each st, ch 2, turn. **57th to 84th rows incl:** Same as 30th to 57th rows of right front.

Sleeves: Ch 21, turn. **1st row:** 2 half d c in 3rd ch from hook and 1 half d c in each st of ch, ch 2, turn. **2nd row:** 1 half d c in each st, with 2 increases at end of row. **3rd row:** 2 increases at beginning of row, 1 half d c in each st of previous row, ch 21, turn. **4th row:** 1 half d c in 3rd ch from hook and in each st of ch, 1 half d c in each st of previous row, 2 increases at

end of row. Ch 2, turn. **5th to 12th rows incl:** Repeat 3rd and 4th rows alternately. **13th to 46th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each st, with increasing 2 sts at armhole side until the 30th row and from this row on, make 2 decreases at armhole. **47th to 58th rows incl:** Shape same as other side of sleeve. Make another sleeve and sew up seams. Join sides of jacket and sew in sleeves.

Collar: Starting at 15th row of right front at neck edge, work 85 half d c along neck edge to within 15 rows from edge of left front. Ch 2, turn. **2nd to 12th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each half d c, ch 2, turn. Cover 6 button forms with crochet, and sew on.

Skirt: The entire skirt is made of strips in the two shades of blue. Make 12 strips of each shade as follows: Ch 125 (or skirt length desired, remembering that there is a certain shrinkage when the next row is worked). **1st row:** 1 half d c in 3rd ch from hook and 1 half d c in each st of ch. Ch 2, turn. **2nd to 10th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each st, ch 2, turn. The ends of the Skipper Blue strips form the waistline. Whip to each other down from the waistline for $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches. After Skipper Blue strips are joined in this way, lay flat on table, spreading evenly with strips 2 inches apart at hemline. Then place Blue Jewel strips underneath, touching each other at the waistline on wrong side, and joining the Skipper Blue strips at the bottom. Pin in place and sew or join with sl st the Skipper Blue strips to the Blue Jewel strips, in a tapering line, fitting them around the hipline and waistline. Leave an opening of about 4 inches down from the waistline on one of the strips.

Blouse: Back: Use No. 5 hook and with Skipper Blue, ch 86, turn. **1st row:** 1 half d c in 3rd ch from hook and in each st of ch. Ch 2, turn. **2nd to 8th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each st, ch 2, turn. Break thread and attach Blue Jewel. Use No. 1 hook and work loosely. **9th to 33rd rows incl:** 1 half d c in each st, ch 3, turn. **34th to 45th rows incl:** Continue half d c in half d c, decreasing 2 sts at beginning and 2 sts at end of row. Break thread.

Front: Same as back.

Sleeves: Use No. 5 hook and with Skipper Blue, ch 66, turn. **1st row:** 1 half d c in 3rd ch from hook and in each st of ch. **2nd to 4th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each

Tweed Mixture Topcoat no. 17

Size 16

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 19 balls of color 84 Beige and 19 balls of 106 Sport Green. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 2.

Gauge: 5 patterns equal 2 inches; and 10 rows equal 2 inches. The swagger lines and saddle shoulder give smartness to this coat. The entire coat is made of one strand of Beige and one strand of Sport Green worked together, and work starts at bottom edge. To begin, ch 396 (to measure about 69 inches). Add more sts if necessary as this foundation ch shrinks in working up. **1st row:** S c in 4th ch from hook, * skip 2 sts, s c in next st, ch 2, s c in same st. Repeat from * along ch. Ch 1, turn. **2nd row:** * S c under next ch-2 loop, ch 2, s c in same loop. Repeat from * across. Ch 1, turn.

Repeat 2nd row until work measures 4 inches. Work next row for 15 inches then decrease one pattern (this comes in line with the underarm). To decrease, make 1 s c under ch-2 loop of previous row and continue working pattern over next pattern across to within 15 inches of other front edge and decrease one pattern. (This leaves about 24 inches for the back). Decrease in this manner every 10 rows, always making decreases directly over previous decreases to form an underarm line. Continue until work measures 28 inches (thus making 26 decreases).

To make right front continue making patterns over the 1st 28 patterns, make 1 s c in next pattern (this is to decrease), ch 1, turn, make pattern over pattern across, keeping the front edge of work even, ch 1, turn, continue with pattern across and decrease 1 pattern at armhole side by making 1 s c in last pattern. Ch 1, turn and make pattern over next pattern. Decrease in

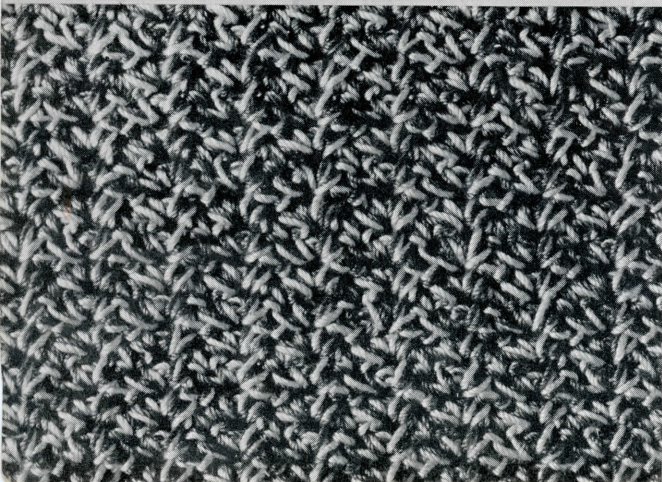
this manner at armhole side for 10 rows, thus decreasing 5 patterns. Work even for 6 more inches, then begin to decrease for shoulder line. At every other row for the next 4 inches, decrease at armhole side of work by making 2 s c together in last pattern without the ch-2 between, ch 1, turn, and make pattern over next pattern. Fasten off. Make left front to correspond.

Back: Skip 4 patterns from front, attach thread in 5th pattern and work across back, decreasing for armhole 1 pattern at each side of back every other row for 2 inches as done for front, then work straight for 6 inches. Begin to decrease for back shoulder lines as done for front for the next 4 inches.

Sleeve: Begin at bottom. Ch 121 (to measure about 20 inches). **1st row:** S c in 4th ch from hook, * skip 2 sts, s c in next st, ch 2, s c in same st. Repeat from * across. Ch 1, turn. (40 patterns.) **2nd row:** * S c under next ch-2 loop, ch 2, s c in same loop. Repeat from * across, ch 1, turn. Repeat 2nd row until work measures 2 inches. Then every 2 inches for the next 6 inches decrease 1 pattern on each side (34 patterns) and work straight for 4 inches. Increase 1 pattern on each side of work every 2 inches for 3 times (40 patterns in all). For the next 3 inches increase 1 pattern on each side at every inch. (46 patterns at underarm). Turn, * sl st over 1st 2 patterns, then make pattern over pattern to within 2 patterns from end of row. Turn, repeat from * for 4 more rows. Decrease 1 pattern by making s c in pattern at end of each row for 17 rows (11 patterns left). Work even for 2 rows. **Next row:** Work over 5 patterns, s c in next, and work over next 5 patterns, ch 1, turn. Work even for 2 inches. * Then make another decrease over previous decrease and work even for 2 more inches. Repeat from * once. Fasten off. Make another sleeve.

Scarf: Ch 50. **1st row:** S c in 4th ch from hook, * skip 2 sts, s c in next st, ch 2, s c in same st. Repeat from * across. Ch 1, turn. **2nd row:** * S c under next ch-2 loop, ch 2, s c in same loop.

Repeat from * across. Ch 1, turn. Repeat 2nd row until work measures 4 inches, then decrease 1 pattern at each end of work. To decrease make s c in last pattern, ch 1, turn, and make pattern over next pattern. * Work for 4 inches and decrease the next row. Repeat



from * 2 more times. Work even for 4 more inches. Then make increases on corresponding rows where decreases were made. To increase make 2 patterns instead of 1 at beginning and at end of row.

Work a row of s c closely around each piece, excepting armholes of coat. Whip sleeve seams. Sew sleeves in place, lapping the sleeve edge over the coat armhole. Stitch in place with a row of back sts under the s c edge. Whip collar in place across the back.

Fagot Knitted Blouse

Square Collar: Using No. 3 needles with Spanish Red, cast on 49 sts. **1st row:** K 1, * thread over needle, k 1, thread over, k 9, thread over, k 1, thread over, * k 25. Repeat from * to *, then k 1. **2nd row:** Cast on 1 st at each end and k across plain. Repeat this row on all even numbered rows. **3rd row:** K 3, * thread over needle, k 1, thread over, k 11, thread over, k 1, thread over, * k 27. Repeat from * to * then k 3. **5th row:** K 5, * thread over needle, k 1, thread over, k 13, thread over, k 1, thread over, * k 29. Repeat from * to * and k 5. **7th row:** K 7, * thread over needle, k 1, thread over, k 15, thread over, k 1, thread over, * k 31 and repeat from * to * and k 7. Continue in this way, putting thread over needle on each side of the 4 single sts, until work is 24 rows deep, then add 4 sts at each end, after which, work straight at each end on the even numbered rows. Continue as before on the odd numbered rows until collar is 44 rows deep. Then cast off. Using crochet hook, finish inside edge with a row of s c. Sew to blouse so that it lies flat around the neck.

Tie: Using No. 3 needles, single thread, cast on 16 sts. **1st row:** K across. **2nd row:** Bring thread to front of needle and slip 1st st. K 1, then k 1 but before taking st off needle, p 1 in same st. K 9, k next 2 together, k 2. **3rd row:** Bring thread to front of needle and slip 1st st. Then k across. Alternate 2nd and 3rd rows until tie is 47 inches long, then cast

off. With the crochet hook, finish the beginning end of tie with a loose row of s c. Then find the middle of tie and attach to center back of blouse. Leave $12\frac{1}{2}$ inches of tie free at each end and ease rest to neck of blouse, allowing 1 inch on each side of center front.



Bell Lace Blouse no. 132

Size 34-36

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 5 balls of color 70 Blue Jewel and 1 ball of color 55 Navy Blue. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 1 or 2. Two buttons.

The pattern should be loosely crocheted so that the work has a soft, lacy effect.

Gauge: 5 patterns equal 2 inches; 6 rows equal 2 inches. For different size or shaping, see directions on page 26.

Back: With main color, ch 140. **1st row:** 2 s c in 4th ch from hook. * Skip 2 ch, sl st into next ch, ch 3, 2 s c into same ch as sl st. Repeat from * for length of ch. Finish with sl st into last ch. Ch 5, turn. **2nd row:** 2 s c into 4th ch from hook, sl st into back loop of top ch of 1st mesh in previous row. * Ch 3, 2 s c in same place as sl st, then sl st into back loop of top ch of next mesh and repeat from * across. Finish with sl st into last mesh of previous row. Ch 5, turn.

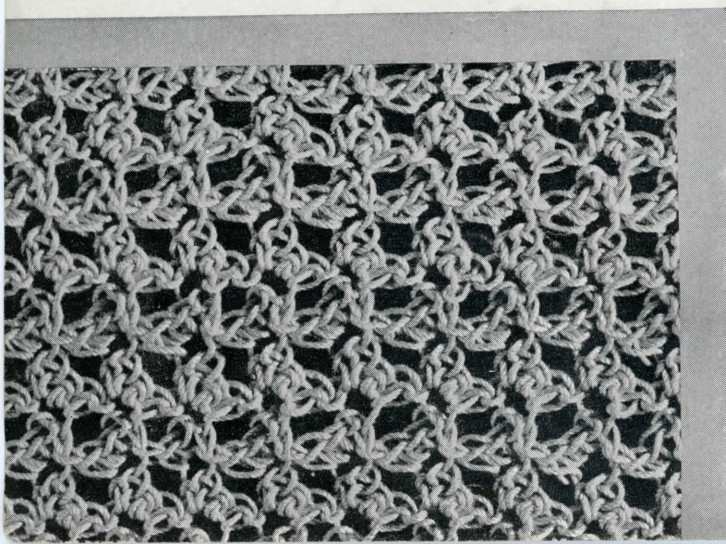
Repeat 2nd row until work measures $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches without stretching. Sl st into top of 1st mesh of previous row. * Ch 3, sl st into next mesh, and repeat from * twice (to decrease 3 meshes for underarm). Continue across as before, but work only to 4th mesh from other end of work, sl st into this mesh, ch 3, turn. Sl st into last mesh of previous row, ch 3, sl st into next mesh, thus decreasing. Then work across as before and decrease 1 mesh at other end. Repeat for 2 more rows, decreasing 1 mesh on each row to complete underarm, then work straight at armhole for 23 rows to bring work to shoulder. Sl st into last mesh, ch 3, turn, sl st

into 1st mesh, ch 3 and sl st into next mesh, thus decreasing 2 meshes. Work across to 3rd mesh from other end. Sl st into this, ch 3, sl st into next, ch 3, and sl st into last mesh. Ch 5, turn. Make 1 s c into 3rd mesh, ch 3, sl st into next mesh, ch 3, sl st, ch 3, and 2 s c into next. Continue to decrease 2 meshes at each end on every row for 6 rows. Into remaining meshes make a row of sl st with ch-2 between. Break off.

Front: Repeat directions for making back and work for 3 rows after completing underarm. Then work across 10 meshes, sl st into 11th mesh and turn to begin opening at front of neck. Work straight at each end for 19 rows to bring work to shoulder. Continue straight at neck, and decrease 2 meshes from the outside edge of work on every row until all meshes have been worked off. Make other side to correspond. Then attach thread at 11th mesh from right side at center front opening, and work across to 11th mesh from other side (to bring edges of the openings close at the bottom), turn and work back, making both edges straight. Continue to 4th row from beginning of opening, then work across only to 4th mesh and turn to begin opening of 1st slash. Work across these meshes for 5 rows, then break thread and repeat across to 4th mesh from other end for 5 rows. Then work the center meshes for 5 rows which completes slashes. Join slashes at the top and work across center piece for 3 rows, turn and finish edge with sl st into each mesh with ch 2 between. Work a close row of s c around each of the slashes.

Waistband: With main color, ch 23. **1st row:** Beginning in 2nd ch from hook, 1 s c into each ch. Ch 1, turn. **2nd row:** 1 s c into back loop of each st of previous row. Repeat 2nd row until work is as long as waist measure without stretching. Then finish off.

Sleeves: With main color, ch 110. Repeat directions for making the back and continue until work is 6 rows deep. Then work only 2 meshes, sl st into 3rd mesh and turn to begin slash. Continue for 5 rows, then repeat at other end for 5 rows, also the center portion for 5 rows.



Join the top of the two slashes and work across the entire sleeve for 2 rows. Instead of turning at the end of the row, bring the 2 ends together to join sleeve opening, and make 15 meshes. Sl st into next mesh and turn to allow for underarm. Ch 3, turn. **14th row:** 1 sl st, ch 3, and 2 s c into 1st mesh of previous row, and work across 29 meshes. Sl st into 30th mesh. Ch 3, turn. **15th row:** Make a sl st, ch 3, and 2 s c into 1st mesh of previous row and work across, finishing with a sl st into last mesh. Repeat 15th row until there are only 3 meshes in the row. Finish with sl st into each mesh with ch 2 between. Break thread. Work a closerow of s c around both slashes, also around bottom and opening of sleeve. Repeat for other sleeve.

Collar: With contrasting color, ch 80. Repeat the directions for making back and then continue until work is 15 rows deep. **16th row:** Work across to 11th mesh. Sl st into 12th mesh. Ch 3, turn. **17th row:** Sl st, ch 3 and 2 s c into 1st mesh of previous row and work across. Work as before with 10 meshes in each row for 21 rows. Then finish with ch 3, turn, and sl st into each mesh with ch 2 between. Break thread and make other side of collar to correspond, but instead of breaking thread, work 2 close rows of s c around outside edges of collar and finish off.

Trimming bows: With contrasting color, ch 31. **1st row:** Beginning in 2nd ch from hook, s c into each ch until 10 s c have been made. Sl st into each of next 10 sts and s c into each of last 10 sts. Ch 1, turn. **2nd row:** Working into back loops of previous row, s c into each of 1st 10 sts, sl st into next 10 sts and s c into each of last 10 sts. Repeat 2nd row until work is 20 rows deep, then finish off. Make 1 bow for each of the sleeves and 1 for front of blouse. Slip them through the slashes and tack them in place.

Sew the back and front of blouse together at the underarms and shoulder. Then ease the bottom into the



waistband without drawing the working thread tight, so that the band can stretch in putting the blouse on over the head. Ease the sleeves into the armholes, and attach the collar. Then finish the edges at the openings in front with a row of s c and attach buttons with loops for fastening.

st, ch 2, turn. Break thread. Attach Blue Jewel and change to No. 1 hook. **5th to 13th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each half d c, ch 3, turn. **14th to 25th rows incl:** Continue half d c in half d c, decreasing 2 sts at beginning and 2 sts at end of each row. Sew front and back together at underarm, and sew in sleeves.

Collar: Attach Navy Blue at shoulder line of neck. Using No. 1 hook make 1 half d c in each half d c around neckline, ch 3, turn. **2nd to 15th rows incl:** 1 half d c in each half d c, with 6 decreases to a row. Using 9 strands of Blue Jewel make a braided cord about a yard long. Lace up neck opening.

Tie Neck Knitted Dress no. 128

Size 34-36

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, for blouse, 5 balls of color 82 Autumn Glow and 1 ball of contrasting color; for skirt, 10 balls of color 82 Autumn Glow; or, if you prefer a pastel, color 26 Nile Green is suggested. Milward's knitting needles, 1 pair of No. 1 ($2\frac{1}{2}$ millimeter) and 1 pair of No. 2 ($2\frac{3}{4}$ millimeter).

Gauge: (Stockinette) 7 sts equal 1 inch; 9 rows equal 1 inch. For different size or shaping, see directions on page 26.

Back of Blouse: Using No. 1 needles, cast on 140 sts. Work ribbing (k 2, p 2) for 4 inches. Change to No. 2 needles.

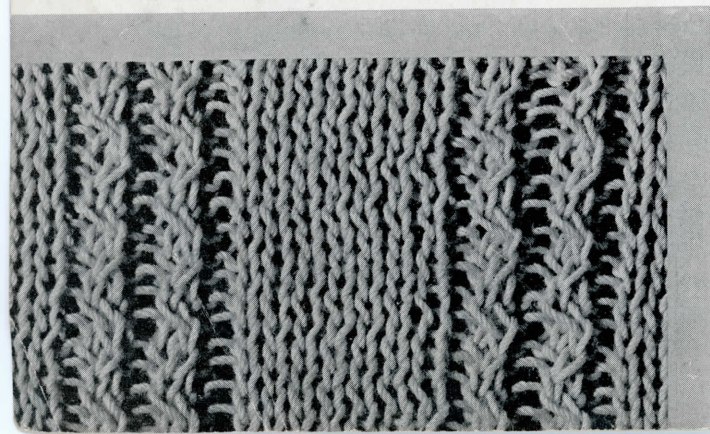
To get twisted effect in lace stripe of blouse, slip 2 sts at the same time as though you were knitting 2 sts together and put them back onto the left needle, then knit them. The slipping makes it possible to knit the 2nd st first and the 1st st second. On the alternate twists the sts are slipped together as though you were purling 2 together. Then knit them. The difference is that in one case the left st comes on top and the other, the right st is on top. As this depends on whether the knitting is done the American way (with thread in right hand) or the Continental way (with the thread held over the 1st finger of the left hand). In the following directions "right twist" indicates that the next 2 sts are twisted so that the right hand st comes on top and the "left twist", when the left hand st is on top.

1st row: * K 14, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1 and repeat from * across. Finish row with k 14.
2nd row: * P 14, k 1, p 2, k 1, p 2, k 1, and repeat from * across. Finish row with p 14. **3rd row:** * K 14, p 1,

1 left twist, p 1, 1 left twist, p 1, and repeat from * across. Finish row with k 14.

4th row: Same as 2nd row. The 4th row completes the pattern. Repeat pattern 22 times (88 rows or 14 inches) which brings work to underarm and beginning of yoke. **93rd row:** Cast off 10 sts. K 4. * P 1, 1 right twist and repeat from * across, ending row with k 14. **94th row:** Cast off 10 sts. P 4, * k 1, p 2, and repeat from * across to last 4 sts. P 2, p 2 together. **95th row:** K 2 together, k 1. * P 1, 1 left twist, and repeat from * across to last 4 sts. K 2, k 2 together. **96th row:** P 2 together, p 1, * k 1, p 2, and repeat from * across. P last 2 sts together. **97th row:** Cast off 1 st. * P 1, 1 right twist, and repeat from * across, k last 2 sts together. **98th row:** Cast off 1 st. * K 1, p 2 and repeat from * across. **99th row:** * P 1, 1 left twist, and repeat from * across. **100th row:** * K 1, p 2, and repeat from * across. **101st row:** * P 1, 1 right twist, and repeat from * across. **102nd row:** Same as 100th row. Repeat from 99th row until work measures $16\frac{1}{2}$ inches from ribbing. Then decrease 3 sts at beginning of every row for 7 rows. Cast off 24 sts at center for neck. Working on one-half of remaining sts, decrease 2 sts at shoulder and 1 st at neck, at beginning of every row, until all sts are worked off. Then make other side to correspond.

Right front: With No. 1 needles, cast on 146 sts. Work ribbing (k 2, p 2) for 4 inches. **1st row:** P 10, * k 1, p 2, k 1, p 2, k 1, p 14, and repeat from * once. Then k 1, p 2, k 1, p 2, k 1, p 10, k 8. Put remaining sts on st holder. **2nd row:** K 18, * p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, k 14, and repeat from * once. P 1, * 1 right twist, p 1, repeat from * once, then k 10. **3rd row:** Same as 1st row. **4th row:** Same as 2nd row, but make left twists instead of right ones. The 4th row completes the pattern. Repeat until work measures 2 inches from ribbing, then make a buttonhole. Cast off 3rd to 6th sts of the next even row of the pattern and on the next row cast them on again, to make buttonhole. Make buttonholes every $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches up the center strip. Work until 23 patterns have been completed (92 rows from ribbing). Reinforce buttonholes with sewing thread and a buttonhole st. **93rd row:** Cast off 10 sts, * k 1, p 2, and repeat from * 15 times, k 1, p 10, k 8. **94th row:** K 18, * p 1, 1 right twist, repeat from * to



end of row, but k last 2 together. **95th row:** K 2 together, * k 1, p 2, and repeat from * 14 more times, k 1, p 10, k 8. **96th row:** K 18, * p 1, 1 left twist, repeat from * to end of row. K last 2 together. **97th row:** * K 1, p 2, and repeat from * 14 more times, k 1, p 10, k 8. **98th row:** K 18, * p 1, 1 right twist, and repeat from * to end of row. **99th row:** Same as 97th row. **100th row:** K 18, * p 1, 1 left twist, repeat from * to end of row. Continue until work measures 14 inches from ribbing. Cast off 8 sts at neck. Then cast off 1 st at neck each row for 20 rows. Then work straight at neck and decrease 12 sts at shoulder at beginning of rows until all sts have been worked off.

Left front: Pick up remaining sts at top of ribbing and begin at outside end. **1st row:** K 10, * p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, k 14, and repeat from * once. P 1, 1 right twist, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, k 10, cast on 8 sts. **2nd row:** K 8, p 10, * k 1, p 2, k 1, p 2, k 1, p 14, and repeat from * once. K 1, p 2, k 1, p 2, k 1, p 10. **3rd row:** K 10, * p 1, 1 left twist, p 1, 1 left twist. P 1, k 14, and repeat from * once. P 1, 1 left twist, p 1, 1 left twist, p 1, k 18. **4th row:** Same as 2nd row. **5th row:** K 10, * p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, k 14, and repeat from * once. P 1, 1 right twist, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, k 18. Repeat from 2nd row until 92 rows have been made. Then make left front correspond to right front. Sew up underarm and shoulder seams.

Sleeves: With No. 1 needles, cast on 90 sts. Work 1½ inches of ribbing (k 2, p 2). Change to No. 2 needles. **1st row:** K 10, * p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, k 14. Repeat from * 2 more times. P 1, 1 right twist, p 1, 1 right twist, p 1, k 10. **2nd row:** P 10, * k 1, p 2, k 1, p 2, k 1, p 14, and repeat from * two more times. K 1, p 2, k 1, p 2, k 1, p 10. **3rd row:** Same as 1st row, but substitute left twists for right ones. **4th row:** Same as 2nd row. The 4th row completes the pattern. Repeat from 1st row until 8 patterns have been made. **33rd row:** P 2 together. * 1 right twist, p 1, and repeat from * across. P last 2 together. **34th row:** * K 1, p 2, and repeat from * across. K last st. **35th row:** P 1, * 1 left twist, p 1, and repeat from * across. **36th row:** Same as 34th row. **37th row:** P 1, * 1 right twist, p 1, and repeat from * across. Repeat from 34th row 3 more times, then decrease 1 st at each end every row until work measures 9 inches from ribbing, then cast off. Repeat for other sleeve. Sew up seams in sleeves and ease into armholes.



Collar: Using No. 2 needles, cast on 18 sts. K plain until work measures 8½ inches, then change to No. 1

* thread over, k 2 together, k 5 and repeat from * across. **26th row:** K plain. Repeat these 2 rows until scarf is desired length. Finish off other end with 24 rows same as 1st 24 rows.

Crocheted Sport Belt no. 264

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 1 ball of color 84 Beige and 1 ball of color 55 Navy Blue. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 3. Use thread double throughout.

With Navy Blue make ch a little longer than desired length of belt (the extra length being taken up with working). **1st row:** 1 d c in 4th ch from hook and in each st of ch. Ch 3, turn. **2nd row:** 1 d c in each of next 2 sts * ch 3, skip 3 sts, 1 d c in each of next 3 sts and repeat from * to end of row. Break thread. Attach Beige. Ch 3, turn. **3rd row:** 1 d c in each st of 2nd row. Ch 3, turn. **4th row:** Same as 2nd row, changing to Navy Blue at end. **5th row:** Same as 3rd row. **6th row:** Same as 4th row. Attach Beige and work around entire belt with 2 rows of 1 s c in each st and 3 s c in each corner st. Cover 2 button forms with Beige, working in s c's.

Off-the-Face Sailor no. 26

22 Head-Size

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 2 balls of color 106 Sport Green. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 4.

Crown: To begin, ch 3. **1st rnd:** 6 s c in 2nd st of ch. **2nd rnd:** 2 s c in each st of previous rnd. **3rd rnd:** * 2 s c in next st, 1 s c in next st, and repeat from * around. **4th rnd:** * 2 s c in next st, 1 s c in each of next 2 sts, and repeat from * around. Continue increasing 6 times in each rnd at equal distances apart. Do not make increases over increases of previous rnd. Work until crown measures $5\frac{3}{4}$ inches in diameter (or more for larger head-size). Work next rnd without increases. In next rnd increase 5 times spaced at equal distances, * work next rnd even, and in next rnd make 4 increases. Repeat from * once. Continue making 1 s c in each st

Knitted Sport Scarf no. 263

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 4 balls of color 84 Beige and 1 ball of color 55 Navy Blue. 1 pair Milward's knitting needles, No. 3 (3 millimeter).

Use thread double throughout. With Navy Blue, cast on 66 sts. **1st row:** * K 6, p 6 and repeat from * ending with k 6. **2nd row:** * P 6, k 6 and repeat from * ending with p 6. **3rd to 8th rows incl:** Repeat 1st and 2nd rows alternately. Break thread and attach Beige. **9th row:** Same as 2nd row. **10th to 16th rows incl:** Repeat 1st and 2nd rows alternately. Break thread and attach Navy Blue. **17th to 24th rows incl:** Same as 1st to 8th rows. Break thread and attach Beige. **25th row:** K 6,

a Hat and a Belt

until crown measures 6 inches from center to edge. Make 1 sl st, turn. (Will measure more if additional rnds were added above).

Brim: Use thread double and work 1 s c in back loop of each st. **2nd to 7th rnds incl:** 1 s c in each st, taking up both loops of st of previous rnd. **8th rnd:** Increase 4 times at equal spaces. **9th rnd:** Work even. **10th rnd:** Work even over 6 inches then increase 1 st every 2 inches for 6 times and work even to finish rnd. **11th to 14th rnds incl:** Work even. Fasten off. Turn brim up all around, flaring at the front.

Twin Scarf no. 281

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 1 ball of Ecu and 1 ball of color 126 Spanish Red. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 3.

With Ecu, ch 72. **1st row:** S c in 6th ch from hook, * ch 2, skip 2 sts of foundation ch, s c in next st, repeat from * along ch. Ch 3 (to count as d c), turn. **2nd row:** 1 d c over ch-2 loop, * 2 d c over next ch-2 loop and repeat from * across. (23 groups of 2-d c). Ch 3, turn. **3rd row:** * S c between next 2-d c groups, ch 2, repeat from * across, ending with s c into 3rd st of turning ch of previous row. Ch 3, turn. **4th row:** Same as 2nd row. **5th to 11th rows incl:** Repeat 3rd and 4th rows alternately. **12th row:** To start shaping scarf do not make 1 d c in 1st loop, * 2 d c over next loop, repeat from * across to next to last loop, then make 1 d c instead of 2 d c over last loop. Ch 3, turn. **13th row:** Decrease by skipping sp between single d c and 2-d c group, * s c in next sp, ch 2 and repeat from * across. At end of row skip sp between last 2-d c group and ch-3, and make s c into 3rd st of turning ch of previous row. Ch 3, turn. **14th row:** 1 d c over ch-2 loop, * 2 d c over next loop and repeat from * across (21 groups of d c). Continue working in pattern, and make decreases as done in

12th and 13th rows at beginning and end of rows 24 and 25; 36 and 37; 48 and 49; 60 and 61. This leaves 13 groups of d c for the 62nd row. After last decrease, work evenly for 5 inches, ending with s c row. Fasten off. Make other half the same, ending with d c row, and whip together. Repeat entire scarf with Spanish Red and catch the two scarfs together at back only.

Gloves and Bags

Knitted Sport Gloves no. 262

Medium Size

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 1 ball of White. 1 set of double-pointed celluloid knitting needles No. 3 (3 millimeter).

Use thread double throughout.

Beginning at cuff, cast on 60 sts. **1st rnd:** K plain. **2nd rnd:** * K 1, k 2 together, thread over twice, k 2 together, and repeat from * around. **3rd rnd:** K plain, working off the thread overs as 1 st (48 sts). **4th rnd:** K 1, * thread over twice, k 2 together, k 2, and repeat from * around. **5th to 16th rnds:** Repeat 3rd and 4th rnds alternately. **17th to 20th rnds:** K plain. **21st rnd:** K 1, * k 2 together, k 2, and repeat from * around. **22nd to 24th rnds incl:** K plain (36 sts). **25th rnd:** K 2, k 2 together, thread over once, k 2, thread over, k 2 together, k 1, thread over, k 2 together and k plain for rest of rnd. **26th rnd:** K plain. **27th rnd:** K 1, k 2 together, thread over, k 3, thread over, k 2 together, k 2, thread over, k 2 together, and k plain for rest of rnd. **28th rnd:** K plain. **29th rnd:** K 2 together, thread over, k 4, thread over, k 2 together, k 3, thread over, k 2 together and k rest of rnd. **30th rnd:** K plain. **31st rnd:** K 6, thread over, k 2 together and k plain rest of rnd. **32nd rnd:** K plain. **33rd rnd:** Same as 25th rnd.

(Right hand). **34th rnd:** K 17, cast on 7 sts, skip 7 sts of rnd below by slipping them on an extra needle and k plain around. **35th to 46th rnds incl:** Repeat 27th to 32nd rnds incl, and 25th to 30th rnds incl, in order. **47th to 59th rnds incl:** K plain.

Forefinger: **1st rnd:** K 3 plain, cast on 2 sts, slip following 24 sts on extra needles, k 9 plain. **2nd to 22nd rnds incl:** K plain (14 sts on needles). Then slip all sts on a crochet hook and draw thread through all loops. Fasten off.

Little finger: Remove 7 of the slipped off sts to a stitch holder. Attach thread to next st and k 10 plain. Cast on 2 sts. **2nd to 19th rnds incl:** K plain and finish off as before.

Ring finger: Cast on 3 sts, k 3 from back side, pick up 4 sts from side of little finger, k 4 from palm side. **2nd to 22nd rnds incl:** K plain and finish off as before.

Middle finger: Pick up 4 sts from ring finger, k 4 sts from back, 3 sts from forefinger and 3 from palm side. **2nd to 23rd rnds incl:** K plain and finish off.

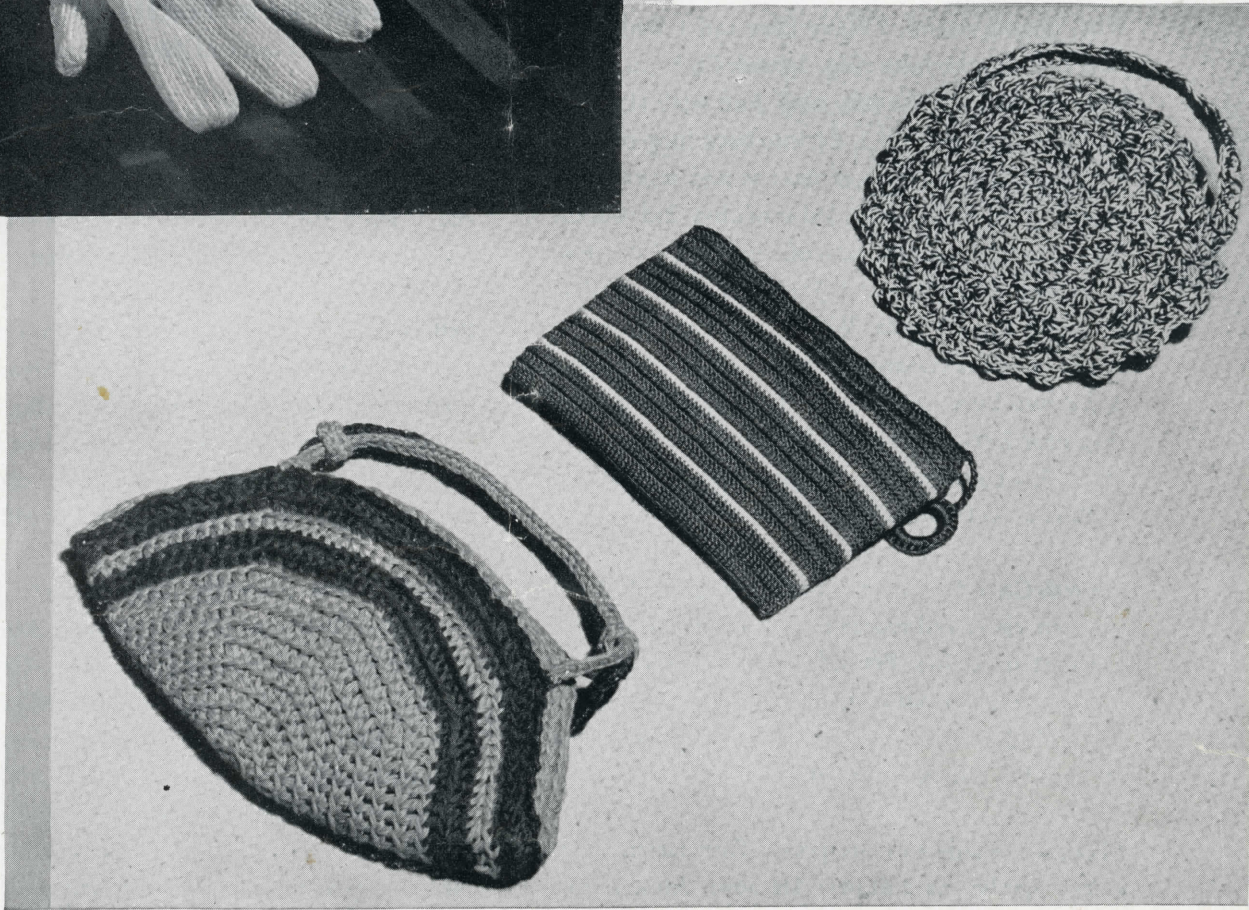
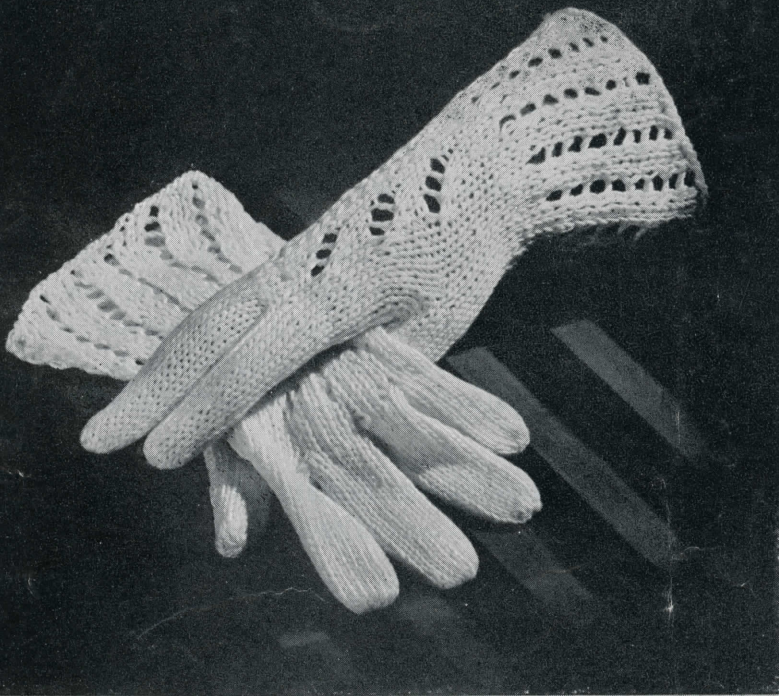
Thumb: K 7 sts slipped off at 34th rnd and pick up 12 sts evenly around opening. **2nd to 11th rnds incl:** Work even rnds straight and decrease 1 st in odd rnds. **12th to 23rd rnds incl:** K plain and finish off.

To make left hand glove work same to end of 33rd rnd. On 34th rnd k 25 and finish same as for right hand.

Pancake Pouch Bag no. 280

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 1 ball of color 70 Blue Jewel and 1 ball of color 68 Skipper Blue. Lining for bag, and 6-inch Talon slide fastener. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 1.

Use thread double throughout. With Blue Jewel, ch 4. Join with sl st to form ring. Work very loosely. **1st rnd:** 8 half d c in ring. **2nd rnd:** 2 half d c in each st of previous rnd. **3rd rnd:** * 1 half d c in next st, 2 half d c in next, and repeat from * around. **4th rnd:** 1 half d c in each st, and 2 half d c over each increase. **5th to 14th rnds incl:** Repeat 4th rnd, changing to Skipper Blue for the 10th, 11th, 13th and 14th rnds. Break off. **Insert:** With Blue Jewel, ch 56, turn. **1st row:** 1 s c in 3rd ch from hook and in each st of ch. **2nd row:** 1 sl st in each st. Ch 2, turn. **3rd row:** 1 s c in each st. **4th row:** Same as 2nd row. **5th row:** 1 s c in each of 1st 14 sts, ch 28, skip 28 sts of previous row, 1 s c in each of next 14 sts. **6th to 10th rows incl:** Alternate 2nd and 3rd rows, ending with 2nd row. Break thread. Sew Talon slide fastener in slit. Sew circular piece around insert, and make handles, one Blue Jewel and one Skipper Blue, ch 61 and work 1 row of s c along ch. Attach as shown in illustration. Sew in lining.



Striped Envelope Purse no. 260

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 1 ball color 106 Sport Green and 1 ball of White. 1 5-inch Talon Hookless Fastener and 1-inch bone ring. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 5 or 6.

With Sport Green, ch 69. **1st row:** S c in 2nd ch from hook and s c in each st of foundation ch. Ch 3 (to count as d c). Work rest of bag in rnds. **2nd rnd:** D c in each st along other side of foundation ch and into

back loop of s c row. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-3 of 1st row. Ch 3 (to count as d c). **3rd rnd:** D c into back loop of each d c of previous rnd. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-3, ch 3. **4th rnd:** Same as 3rd. **5th rnd:** Attach White and work rnd of s c. This rnd completes the pattern. Continue working 3 rnds of d c with Sport Green, and 1 rnd of s c with white until there are 4 White stripes. Then work 3 more rnds of Sport Green and break off.

Using thread double cover bone ring with rnd of s c's. Join to 1st s c with sl st and ch 12 and attach to

one corner at top of bag. Line bag and sew in Talon Hookless Fastener.

Tweed Pouch no. 261

(Illustration on page 25)

Materials: J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen, 1 ball color 55 Navy Blue, 1 ball of White, or other color combination desired. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 3 or 4. Talon Hookless Fastener, 5 inches long.

With double strand, 1 Navy Blue and 1 White, ch 5. Join with sl st to form ring. **1st rnd:** Ch 3 (to count as half d c), 9 half d c's into ring. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-3. **2nd rnd:** Ch 3, d c into back loop of next st, * 2 d c into back loop of next st and repeat from * around. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-3. **3rd rnd:** Ch 3, * d c into back loop of each of next 2 sts, 2 d c in next and repeat from * around. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-3. **4th and 5th rnds:** Work as before, making increases when necessary to keep work flat. **6th rnd:** Ch 3, d c into back loop of next st, ch 3, s c in same st, * skip next 2 sts and make 2 d c into back loop of next st, ch 3, s c into same st. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to 1st st of ch-3.

7th rnd: Ch 3, * s c over next ch-3 loop, ch 3, 2 d c in same sp, ch 1, and repeat from * around. Join with sl st to 1st st of ch-3. **8th rnd:** Ch 3, d c over next ch-3 loop, ch 3, s c in same sp, ch 1, * 2 d c over next ch-3 loop, ch 3, s c in same sp, ch 1, and repeat from * around. **9th rnd:** Same as 7th rnd.

Make other side to correspond. Then fasten the two sides together as follows: **1st row:** Attach double thread, ch 3, 2 d c over ch-3 loops of both sides, ch 3, s c in same sp, * ch 1, 3 d c over next ch-3 loops, ch 3, s c in same sp, and repeat from * leaving 9 patterns free

across top of bag. Ch 3, turn. **2nd row:** 2 d c over ch-3 loop, ch 3, s c in same sp, * ch 1, 3 d c over next loop, ch 3, s c in same sp, repeat from * along previous row.

Handle: Ch 53. **1st row:** 1 half d c in 3rd ch from hook and 1 half d c in each st of ch. Ch 3, turn, and make 3 more rows of half d c's in half d c's of previous row. Line bag, sew in Talon Hookless Fastener across curve at top, and attach handle at each end of fastener.

needles. Slip 1st st, k 1, * bring thread in front of needles and slip 1, k 1, and repeat from * until narrow portion is 18 inches long. Then change to No. 2 needles and k plain for 8½ inches, then cast off. Attach to neck, leaving center flap of blouse free.

Belt: With contrasting color, using No. 1 needles, cast on 16 sts. **1st row:** Slip 1, k 1, *bring thread in front of needles and slip 1, thread back of needle, k 1. Repeat from * across. Repeat this row until belt is 33 inches long. Cast off and fold to make point at one end and tack in place. Attach buckle to other end of belt.

Skirt: With No. 2 needles, cast on 200 sts. **1st row:** K 1, p 1, across. **2nd row:** P 1, k 1, across. Alternate these 2 rows until work measures 1½ inches. Change to No. 1 needles and work remainder of skirt in stockinette st (k 1 row, p 1 row). Decrease 1 st at each end every 15th row until work measures 25 inches. Then decrease 1 st at each end every 5th row for 9 inches. Then work 2 inches of ribbing (k 2, p 2). The skirt is made in two pieces. Repeat for back of skirt, then sew up the two side seams, leaving the left seam open for 7½ inches at the top. Repeat directions for making belt and work a strip for facing of placket. Attach to belting.

For Correct Fitting or Size Alteration

To insure perfect fitting of crocheted or knitted garments, it is advisable to make a tracing on heavy paper of a pattern that fits you. Make a tracing for both the back and front and for sleeves, if the garment you are making has them. The tracing can be made from any good commercial foundation pattern. As your work progresses, lay it over the drawing from time to time and increase or decrease as necessary to make the gar-

ment fit. For crocheted garments, lay your first chain of stitches onto your pattern. The chain should be approximately one-fifth longer than your pattern is wide as the crochet stitches take up this amount in the chain.

If you crochet or knit very loosely, use a smaller hook or needles than specified, and if your work is unusually tight, use larger sizes.

How to Launder Crocheted and Knitted Garments

Garments and articles made of J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen may be laundered with entire satisfaction if the following suggestions are observed. Because the colors are BOILFAST they retain their clear, fresh appearance even after many washings.

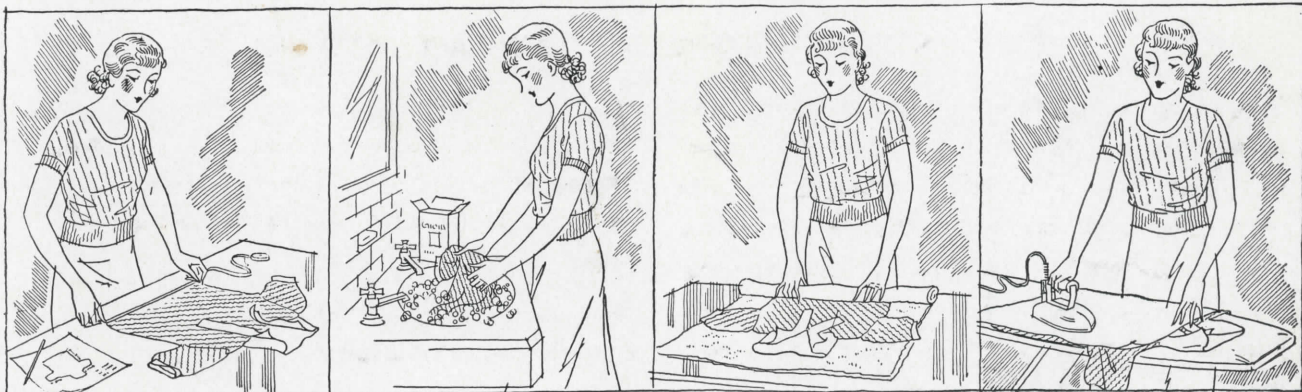


Before you wash an article make a rough diagram of the size and shape, taking careful measurements with a tape measure and noting them on your diagram.

Use a good neutral soap or soap flakes and make suds in warm water. Squeeze the garment to remove soil and stains, rather than rubbing. It is well to repeat the process in new suds. Then rinse two or three times in clear, lukewarm water, making sure all soap is removed.

Lay the article in a Turkish towel, roll it up carefully, and squeeze to remove the excess water. Then spread it out on a dry Turkish towel, drawing it into its original size and shape. Pin in place, if necessary, and allow to dry completely. Garments should never be hung up to dry.

Always press from the wrong side. Lay the article on the pressing board and hold it in shape. Place a damp cloth flat on the article and pass a hot iron over it, allowing the steam to go through to the article. Lift the iron from place to place instead of "ironing".

Materials Required:

AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "GEM" COTTON YARN.

1—80 yd. Skein Black.

1—80 yd. Skein Red.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 6.

With Red, ch 3, 7 s c in 1st st of ch, do not join this or following rows.

2nd Row: 2 s c in each s c, and work 8 more rows of s c, increasing a sufficient number of times to keep work flat.

11th Row: Sl st in back loop of s c, * ch 3, d c in same space, skip 2 s c, sl st in back loop of next s c, repeat from * all around. Join in loop of shell, ch 3, turn, d c in same space, and work 5 more rows of shells joining each row and turning each row, break yarn. With Black work a row of s c around lower edge of hat. Join Black in back loop of st at crown of hat and work 2 rows of s c even. **3rd Row:** Increase 6 sts in row and work 1 row even, break yarn.

BALL FRINGE BEANIE—No. 1032

Materials Required:

AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "GEM" COTTON YARN.

2—80 yd. Skeins White or Colors.

1/2 yd. Ball Fringe.

4 double pointed Knitting Needles No. 6.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 4.

Gauge: 3 1/2 sts = 1 inch — 6 rows = 1 inch.

CROWN: On 3 No. 6 Needles cast on 9 sts (3,3,3) join in round, being careful not to twist the sts and K each round.

Round 1—Increase 1 st at the beginning of each needle. **Round 2**—Increase 1 st in every 2nd st. **Round 3**—K 1 round even. **Round 4**—Increase 1 st in every 3rd st. **Round 5**—K 1 round even.

Continue increasing in this way until there are 24 sts on each needle, 72 sts in all. K 4 rounds even. Then increase again, 6 sts in one round, making 78 sts in all. K 5 rounds even. Crown should measure 5 1/4 ins. from beginning to edge. Bind off so that edge measures 2 1/2 inches or required head size.

SHAPED HALO FOR HAT: On 2 No. 6 needles cast on snugly, 43 sts. Purl the first and every uneven row. (Inc = increase tog = together)

2nd Row: K 2 sts tog, K 7, inc. 1 st in next st, K 7, inc. 1 st in next st, K 7, inc. 1 st in next st, K 7, inc. 1 st in next st, K 7, K 2 sts tog. **4th Row:** K 2 sts tog, K 6, inc. 1 st in next st, K 8, inc. 1 st in next st, K 8, inc. 1 st in next st, K 8, inc. 1 st in next st, K 6, K 2 sts tog. **6th Row:** K 2 sts tog, K 5, inc. 1 st in next st, K 9, inc. 1 st in next st, K 9, inc. 1 st in next st, K 9, inc. 1 st in next st, K 6, K 2 sts tog. **8th Row:** K 2 sts tog, K 4, inc. 1 st in next st, K 10, inc. 1 st in next st, K 10, inc. 1 st in next st, K 10, inc. 1 st in next st, K 6, K 2 sts tog. **9th Row:** Purl across row. Bind off. This is the top of the halo.

Finishing: Block halo flat. Work one row of single crochet over curved part (top). Block crochet. Sew tape of ball fringe over crochet edge of halo. Pin halo around bottom edge of hat and single crochet the two together, continuing around rest of hat in s c.

LOOP BEANIE — No. 1033

Materials Required:

AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "GEM" COTTON YARN.

1—80 yd. Skein Red.

1—80 yd. Skein Black or any two colors desired.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 5 or 6.

With Black ch 3, join, ch 1 and work 6 s c in ring, join each row. **2nd Row:** Ch 1, 2 s c in each s c. (12 s c). **3rd Row:** 2 s c in each s c. (24 s c). **4th Row:** * 1 s c in each of next 2 s c, puff st in next s c, repeat from * all around.

(Puff St: Yarn over, insert in next s c, yarn over, pull through, yarn over, insert in same space, yarn over, pull through, yarn over, pull through all loops on needle, ch 1).

5th Row: 1 s c in each s c and ch 1 (32 s c).

Repeat the last two rows alternately 4 times, having one more s c between puff sts in each puff st row.

There should be 64 s c in 13th row. Break yarn.

With wrong side of work toward you, join Red in top loop of st only and work 1 s c in each s c increasing 1 s c between each puff st section. (72 s c) join, ch 1 and turn work.

2nd Row: Carry Black under sts and work 1 s c in each s c between the puff sts of crown. Over puff st work a puff st in Black (Drop Red, pick up Black, carry Red under). Yarn over, insert in st, yarn over pull through, yarn over, insert in same space, yarn over pull through, yarn over, pull through all Black on needle. Drop Black, pick up Red, over and through Black and Red loop left on needle. Do not chain after puff st, continue working s c in Red and puffs in Black all around. Join.

3rd Row: 1 s c in each s c increasing between puff sts.

4th Row: Repeat puff st row. **5th Row:** Repeat s c row. **6th Row:** Work puff st row decreasing 1 s c between each puff st section. (72 s c). **7th Row:** With Red only, work 1 row of s c into free loop of crown easing in one st of Red between each puff st section of Black. **8th & 10th Rows:** Repeat puff st row. **9th & 11th Rows:** Repeat s c row. **12th Row:** Work a puff st in every other s c, break yarn.

Cord: With Black ch 5, join, ch 1 and without joining rows continue in s c picking up one loop only. Continue until work measures about 40 inches. Form 3 loops which may be wired if desired and attach to hat as illustrated.

PIXIE BEANIE — No. 1034

Materials Required:

AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "GEM" COTTON YARN.

2—80 yd. Skeins Blue or any color desired.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 4.

Ch 22 and work 21 s c on chain, ch 1, turn.

2nd Row: 1 s c in 1st s c * ch 1, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c, repeat from * across row, and work 6 more rows same as 2nd row.

9th Row: Decrease by skipping the first s c and ch and work remainder of row same as 2nd row.

10th Row: Work same as 9th row.

11th & 12th Rows: Work even.

13th, 14th, 17th, 18th, 21st, 22nd, 25th, Rows: Work same as 9th row.

15th, 16th, 19th, 20th, 23rd, 24th Rows: Same as 11th row. Break yarn, and work 3 more sections. Crochet them together on the right side matching rows.

Trim: Twist 3—3 1/2 yard lengths of yarn, fold them and taking hold of both ends allow remainder to twist itself. Knot about 2 inches apart and sew cord thus formed to lower edge of hat as illustrated.

Take 6—1 yd. lengths and twist them in same manner. Tie a knot at one end of cord, sew the cord around knot once and sew to top of hat.

Divide the remainder of yarn into 2 strands each and tie 3 knots in 3 strands about 2 inches apart and in the other 3 strands 1 1/2 inches apart. The trim may be made in a contrasting color if desired.
