SPONSORED BY: **MIGUEL GOMEZ ERIC GRIEGO** 1 RESOLUTION 2 APPROVING THE WEST CENTRAL METROPOLITAN REDEVELOPMENT PLAN; AND SPECIFICALLY INCLUDING THE ENTIRE WEST CENTRAL 3 METROPOLITAN REDEVELOPMENT AREA (MRA) FOR PURPOSES OF TAX 4 5 INCREMENT FINANCING. 6 WHEREAS, the New Mexico Legislature has passed the Metropolitan 7 Redevelopment Code (herein "Code"), Sections 3-60A-1 to 3-60A-48 NMSA 8 1978, which authorizes the City of Albuquerque, New Mexico ("City") to 9 prepare metropolitan redevelopment plans and to undertake and carry out 10 metropolitan redevelopment projects; and 11 WHEREAS, the City Council, the governing body of the City ("City 12 Council"), after notice and a public hearing as required by Code, has duly 13 passed and adopted Council Resolution No. F/S R-216, Enactment 82-2001, 14 finding, among other things, that one or more slum areas or blighted areas 15 exist in the City and that the rehabilitation, conservation, development, and 16 redevelopment of the area designated as the West Central MRA is necessary 17 in the interest of the public health, safety, morals and welfare of the residents 18 of the City; and 19 WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Development Commission ("Commission"), 20 which acts as the Metropolitan Redevelopment Commission under provisions 21 of Section 14-8-4 R.O.A. 1994 at their meeting on December 17, 2003, after 22 notice, conducted a public hearing on the Plan and after the public hearing, 23 recommended approval of the West Central Metropolitan Redevelopment Plan; 24

1	WHEREAS, the following findings were presented to the Albuquerque
2	Development Commission for the West Central Metropolitan Plan; and
3	WHEREAS, the City Council, after notice, has conducted a public hearing
4	pursuant to Subsection 3-60A-8(B) of the Code, after proper notice as required
5	by such subsection to the Plan; and
6	WHEREAS, the Plan will promote the local health, general welfare, safety,
7	convenience and prosperity of the inhabitants of the City.
8	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
9	ALBUQUERQUE:
10	SECTION 1. The City Council, after having conducted a public hearing
11	pursuant to the Code, adopts the West Central Metropolitan Redevelopment
12	Plan, as attached hereto and incorporated herein.
13	SECTION 2. The entire West Central MRA is specifically included for
14	purposes of tax increment financing.
15	SECTION 3. That Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) of the
16	uncommitted Metropolitan Redevelopment Fund (Fund 275) balance and Two
17	Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) of the Community and Economic
18	Development Reserve Fund be appropriated to Albuquerque Development
19	Services in order to fund land assembly and public improvements needed to
20	facilitate the West Central redevelopment.
21	SECTION 4. The City Council, after having conducted a public hearing
22	pursuant to the Code, finds that:
23	A. The Plan proposes activities for the redevelopment of the West Central
24	MRA that will aid in the elimination and prevention of slum and blight or
25	conditions, which lead to the development of slum and blight; and
26	B. The Plan does not require the relocation of any families and individuals
27	from their dwellings and a method for providing relocation assistance is not
28	needed; and
29	C. The Plan conforms to and complements the Albuquerque/Bernalillo
30	County Comprehensive Plan; and
31	D. The Plan affords maximum opportunity consistent with the needs of the
32	community for the rehabilitation or redevelopment of the West Central MRA by

private enterprise or persons, and the objectives of the Plan justify the proposed activities as public purposes and needs.

SECTION 5. The Plan is hereby approved in all respects.

SECTION 6. The City shall support the creation of a West Central Community Development Corporation (WCCDC) for the purpose of obtaining funding for redevelopment activities and providing guidance and technical assistance to businesses wishing to open, operate and/or expand within the WCMDA.

SECTION 7. The City shall support the proposed WCCDC to provide technical assistance to businesses within the WCMDA including, without limitation, training in business practices, market and product research, marketing, access to capital and facility improvements.

SECTION 8. The City shall support efforts to establish programs such as Mainstreet and/or Transit Related Development programs to enhance redevelopment efforts in the WCMRA.

SECTION 9. The City shall support efforts to create a family recreation complex on the west side of the Rio Grande within the WCMRA. The proposed complex shall be designed to integrate with neighboring land uses.

SECTION 10. The City shall support efforts to attract businesses that provide high paying jobs to the Atrisco Business Park. For these purposes, "high paying jobs" shall be defined as jobs with average wages 20% above the average wages for the census tracts within the WCMRA."

SECTION 11. All resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed; this repealer shall not be construed to revive any resolution, or part thereof, heretofore repealed.

SECTION 12. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word, or phrase of this resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this resolution. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this resolution and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provisions being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.
