This ordinance proposes to amend the official zone map for 55 acres of land in the northwest quadrant of the City. The zone change request is from the R-1D zone to the R-1B zone in certain areas of the project site. It is proposed that the R-1D zone remain in place for parcels near the Petroglyph National Monument.
