This memorandum serves to convey the articulation for APD's points of non-concurrence in the above captioned administrative investigation conducted by the Civilian Police Oversight Agency.

Rationale for non-concurrence of action for 2-48-2-D-2c:

I reviewed this investigation and concurred with the CPOA on the sustained finding. I did not concur with the proposed discipline of a verbal reprimand and chose to impose a non-disciplinary corrective action (NDCA). Officer S did attempt to contact the owner and left a voicemail message and also requested NCIC help with the notification to ensure the owner was aware of the situation. He did everything except complete the towed vehicle notification. Officer S also demonstrated some confusion with the new Mark 43 reporting system. Based on this information, this issue of concern can be corrected through guidance from his supervisor.

Conclusion:

Based on my assessment of the facts derived from this investigation, I have deemed it appropriate to deviate from the CPOA's discipline recommendation of a verbal reprimand and concur with the decision to impose a NDCA for the Class 7, Performance, 1st Offense. An NDCA is appropriate given the aforementioned information as well as falling within the allowable range of the DAP.
