2.41.4.A.2.a The lapel video showed Officer P issued the citations and explained the citations. Ms. B son admitted to speeding, and her son signed the document. Ms. Burgos' son did not ask questions, make comments, or contest the citations as presented. 2.40.3.C.1 The lapel video showed Officer P had provided Ms. B son with 3 traffic citations (no insurance, no registration, and speeding); he explained each citation to him and informed him of signing each citation. A minor in possession of a driver's license is subject to the normal requirements of the Motor Vehicle Code unless the offense is listed as one of the exceptions in state statute 32A-2-3(A)(1), of which speeding is not one of the exceptions. It is within policy to issue a penalty assessment to a minor. Ms. B son did not request a consultation with his parents. The lapel video did not show a lack of understanding, confusion, or extreme nervousness on the part of Ms. B son.

2.8.5.A videos of the phone calls, required by policy, were not located on a search of videos. The Civilian Police Oversight Board recommends a written reprimand.

You have the right to appeal this decision. If you are not satisfied with the findings of the CPOA Executive Director within 30 calendar days (inclusive of holiday and weekends) of receipt of this letter, communicate your desire to have an appeal hearing before the CPOA Board in a signed writing addressed to the CPOA Director. Upon receipt of the communication, a hearing will be scheduled at the Board's next regularly scheduled meeting provided there is at least ten days between the receipt of the request and the next meeting.

During the hearing you will have the opportunity to address the Board and provide information regarding your case. The Board will have already reviewed the investigation. When presenting your information please focus on providing information that shows:

- A) The findings by the Director had no explanation that would lead to the conclusion made; or,
- B) The findings by the Director were not supported by evidence that was available at the time of the investigation; or,
- C) The APD policy or APD policies that were considered by the Director were the wrong policies or they were used in the wrong way; or,
- D) The APD policy or APD policies considered by the Director were chosen randomly or they do not address the issues in your complaint.

This information is what is needed for the Board to change the findings and/or recommendations or make further recommendations to the Chief of Police.

Administratively closed complaints may be re-opened if additional information becomes available. Please provide your additional information in writing to the CPOA Director as listed above.

If you are not satisfied with the final disciplinary decision of the Chief of Police or any matter relating to the Chief's handling of the complaint you may request a review of the complaint by the City's Chief Administrative Officer. Your request must be in writing and within 30 calendar days (inclusive of holidays and weekends) of receipt of this letter. Include your CPC number.
