Brief overview of the agenda items/presentations was provided by Gary Oppedahl as requested by D. Johnson, who chaired the meeting w/Don Powers in attendance via conference call.

New Mexico Start-Up Factory II – Dorian Rader, John Chavez

NMSUF II is a New Mexico based LLC founded by the New Mexico Angels. The application for EDAct funding is for the second phase of what is an NM Angels initiative to insure viable technology commercialization projects are available and suited for venture capital investment.

Background of both presenters provided included John Chavez, success with StartUp companies that includes: Samba Safety, Phase One Ventures, Lotus Leaf Coatings. John Chavez, is also former NM Cabinet Secretary for Taxation and Revenue. He became an NM Angels investor in 2004 and President of NM Angels in 2008.

Dorian Rader, Co-founder of StartUp Factory, is also VP of Business Development for NM Angels and currently working with Village Capital Water Accelerator. Along with vast expertise with StartUp venture capital investment her prior work experience at UNM included working at the Patent Office at Science and Technology Corp. at UNM.

Project History

NM StartUp Factory started in 2010 as result of efforts to identify and validate coding technology. It was from this model, which was designed to identify technology based investable companies that resulted in the creation of StartUp Factory. Today, StartUp Factory is a recognized Albuquerque-based technology transfer company.

The problem identified that StartUp Factory was founded to address stemmed from the reality that there is over \$2.3 billion spent annually on research in New Mexico, and less than 1% of that funding leads to the creation of start-up companies. Additionally, licensing from the Labs and Universities is difficult, and scientists are hesitant to leave their jobs for entrepreneurship. StartUp Factory provides the resources to support both the needs of the researcher, while working to insure NM captures a job/company creation portion from the research dollars being spent in New Mexico annually.

StartUp Factory focuses on finding technology with market and commercial potential at UNM, LANL, Sandia, NMSU and NM Tech. Primary focused remains on the identification of capital consuming investable companies that will continue to stay in New Mexico and grow.

StartUp Factory company successes include: Lotus Leaf Coatings, EcoPesiticides, Aquaculture, Zocere, Exovita Biosciences and Zocera. To date, \$680k has been raised for Zocera, which also secured an issued patent from UNM earlier this year.

Standing up companies that possess proven technology with strong IP is the expertise highlighted in the presentation. By deploying small amounts of Startup capital, StartUp Factory works with the principal Investigators and to match resources within its technology network to find the right people needed to support the launch of a new technology company.

The project's operation cost includes the identification of technologies, commercialization, marketing and business plan development. Educational events administered also includes, promoting technology transfer, scientific entrepreneurialism travel. Travel is to source technologies from around the state. StartUp Factory works to recruit corporate management talent and staff the recruitment of investors.

The request for EDAct funding is to support the operation cost/expenses of StartUp Factory and not the funding of any one specific company. Plans, for funding if awarded will also create a full-time staff position. The full-time project manager position would support the creation of twice the number of StartUp companies accomplished by the initial StartUp Factory from 2010 to 2014. The current project has already secured a 100% in funding to match the \$200,000 EDAct funding request.
