

Executive Order From the Office of the Mayor

Whereas, The Albuquerque Human Rights Ordinance, which now prohibits discrimination on the basis of age, ancestry, color, cultural headdress, disability, gender, gender identity, national origin, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, and source of income in housing, employment, and public accommodation, first took effect on New Year's Day 1974; and

Whereas, The Universal Declaration of Human Rights represents the shared commitment of all nations to build a more humane world after the devastation of World War II, the Holocaust, and the Nakba; and

Whereas, Each year since 1950, December 10th has been declared as "Human Rights Day" when all nations memorialize the achievement of an international consensus on basic rights and recommit themselves to upholding, defending and respecting the human rights of all; and




Now, Therefore, I, Timothy M. Keller, Mayor of the City of Albuquerque, do hereby proclaim, December 10, 2024, as:
