What are Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA)? AKA Flood Zones.

Zone Type's

"X": A flood that has a 0.2% Chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year. Also known as the 500 year flood. This area has a low to moderate chance of flooding. The purchase of flood insurance as a condition for granting a loan is not required but encouraged. One to four unit buildings are eligible for the Preferred Risk Policy if flood insurance is purchased voluntarily.

"X protected by Levee":

Same as zone X, just a designation that the area is being protected by a levee. If the levee's were not present, the designation would change to one of the SFHA's listed below.

"A": High flood risk area. No <u>Base Flood Elevation</u> (BFE) or flood depths given. Building in this area is not allowed, unless a hydraulic analysis of the area is derived by a Professional Engineer and a BFE is provided.

SFHA's Continued

Zone Type's

I": Areas of shallow flooding, consists of ponding 1 to 3 feet in depth. BFE's are given in relation to a national datum.

"AO": Areas of sheet flow on sloping terrain, 1 to 3 feet in depth. BFE's are given based on feet above grade.



"AE": Areas of floodways, such as ravines', arroyos', pathway's, BFE's given.




Sample map of Special Flood Hazard Areas along the river.
