CERTIFICATE OF CANVASS
October 6, 2009**

We, the Municipal Canvass Board, made up of Randy M. Autio, the duly appointed and qualified Interim City Clerk of the City of Albuquerque, New Mexico, and Victor E. Valdez, Metropolitan Court Judge, for the County of Bernalillo, hereby certify that on the 6th day of October 2009, the Office of the City Clerk conducted a Regular Municipal Election. The purpose of the election was to vote for electing the Mayor and five (5) City Councilors; vote on a one-quarter cent transportation tax; ten (10) General Obligation Bond questions; and, vote on ten (10) Propositions concerning elections, a salary commission, the Clerk, petitions, the budget, ethics, zoning and planning, Charter dispute resolution, signature requirement, and the City Attorney. The election returns from said election were canvassed by the Municipal Canvassing Board Pursuant to Section 3-8-53, N.M.S.A. 1978, on October 16, 2009. The results are as follows:


We further certify that from the canvass we ascertained that the Transportation Gross Receipts Tax passed.


